SUBJECT: Contract Award to - All American Asphalt
for the Preventive Maintenance of Streets – 2005
for an Amount Not to Exceed \$1,122,000

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council:

1. Accept the bid dated July 5, 2005 submitted by All American Asphalt, in response to the Specifications for the Preventive Maintenance of Streets – 2005, reject all other bids received, and authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract not to exceed \$1,122,000, which includes the base bid of \$1,019,504 and \$102,496 for any additional work the City may order pursuant to the project specifications.
2. Acknowledge the project to be categorically exempt under Section 21084 of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) in accordance with Article 19, Section 15301 (Class 1), subsection (c) of the Resources Agency of California Guidelines (repair of existing public streets) pursuant to the findings of the Secretary of the Resources Agency and authorize the City Manager to execute and the City Clerk to file a Notice of Exemption for the project with the Los Angeles County Clerk.

BACKGROUND

This project consists of resurfacing sixteen street segments. It covers 3.8 miles of City streets. A list of all street segments is included in Attachment "A."

The resurfacing work includes construction of conventional asphalt concrete overlay, or asphalt rubber hot mix overlay; localized street reconstruction including the removal of existing asphalt concrete pavement, the compaction of the sub-grade, and placement of crushed aggregate base and asphalt concrete pavement; header cutting; cold milling of existing asphalt concrete; adjustment of existing utility manholes and valve frame and covers; the installation of permanent traffic striping and raised pavement markers; and miscellaneous appurtenant work.

Plans and specifications for the subject project, which is included in the proposed FY 2006 Capital Improvement Program, were prepared by the Department of Public Works.

In accordance with Section 4.08.070 of the Pasadena Municipal Code, bids have been requested and received.

A finding of compliance with the General Plan was previously made and is shown on page 2.1 of the FY 2006-2010 Capital Improvement Program.

Under the State Guidelines for the Implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), this project is categorically exempt since the work consists of the maintenance of existing public streets. Therefore, it is recommended that a Notice of Exemption be filed with the Los Angeles County Clerk.

This project was advertised in the Pasadena Journal on June 9, 2005. In addition, the Notice Inviting Bids was published in three trade publications. Bid packets were obtained by eleven contractors, four of whom submitted bids for the project.

Following advertising, bids were received on July 6, 2005 and are as follows:

3. Sully-Miller Contracting Company, Anaheim	\$1,225,185.00
4. Gentry Brothers, Inc., Irwindale	\$1,250,283.50

The lowest bid received was 17.7% lower than the Engineer's Estimate of \$1,238,000.

It is recommended that All American Asphalt be awarded the contract for this project as they are the lowest responsive and responsible bidder and that all other bids be rejected. The proposed contract with All American Asphalt fully complies with the competitive bidding ordinance and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder as did the Contractor selection process. The Contractor has indicated that the award of this contract will result in no new hires to his present workforce.

The contract for this project will be set as follows:



Contingencies	\$ 102,496
CONTRACT NOT TO EXCEED	\$1,122,000

It is anticipated that construction will begin in August, 2005 and be completed in October, 2005.


FISCAL IMPACT:

Sufficient funding for this project is available in Budget Account 73580 (Preventive Maintenance - Asphalt Streets). In addition, the Water and Power Department will fund approximately \$51,000 from Budget Accounts 8114-401-843130-30-0594-20221 and 8114-402-883300-00-0761-00000 for adjustment of their facilities.


