RE: Commission Assignments

Staff was asked to prepare information for a City Council discussion regarding how items are directed to commission agendas outside of standard procedures.

The following documents define the scope of each commission's agenda:

- 1. The Pasadena Municipal Code identifies the roles and responsibilities for each Advisory Body (Attachment A)
- 2. With the exception of the Old Pasadena Parking Meter Advisory Commission, each commission has adopted by-laws which have also been approved by City Council (Attachment A)
- 3. City Council approves annual work plans for each commission which will provide items for the agenda
- 4. Some commissions have adopted other rules and procedures to assist them with their work, in particular Code Enforcement and Transportation Advisory Commission (Attachment B)
- 5. On occasion, City Council refers an item to a commission or adds a specific review to the entitlement process during a City Council meeting.

Staff reviewed cases where items, outside the scope as defined previously were added to commission agendas. The following represent the methods that were used:

- 1. A commission requested another commission review an item
- 2. An individual Councilmember or a Council Committee have asked a commission to take on an additional assignment
- 3. An individual commissioner or the Chair requested an item be placed on the agenda
- 4. A commission, by majority vote, decided to place an item on a current or future agenda

City Council has previously addressed questions 1, 3 and 4 in Pasadena Municipal Code (PMC) Chapter 2.45.060 (Attachment C) which states "If a commission has a question as to whether it has jurisdiction over a particular matter, or should one commission wish to review a matter within the jurisdiction of another commission or public body which cannot be resolved cooperatively, the commission shall direct a request shall set forth the objectives of the review and propose both a process and a timetable for completion."
