SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF THE APPLICATION AND RESOLUTION FOR TWO **ENVIRONMENTAL ENHANCEMENT MITIGATION GRANTS - FOR** STREET TREE PLANTING AND HABITAT RESTORATION IN THE

ARROYO SECO

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

- 1. Adopt a resolution authorizing an application for the competitive Environmental Enhancement and Mitigation Grant program of 2004-2005 in the amount of \$75,000 for planting trees and shrubs at the southern entrance to the Lower Arroyo Seco Park; and
- 2. Adopt a resolution authorizing an application for the competitive Environmental Enhancement and Mitigation Grant program of 2006-2007 in the amount of \$200,000 for planting street trees throughout the City and habitat restoration in the open space area of the Arroyo Seco.

BACKGROUND:

The California Department of Transportation administers the Environmental Enhancement and Mitigation Grant Program for both grants. Staff submitted an application for the 2004-2005 EEM Grant Program in November 2004. Staff received word that the application for \$75,000 was approved pending its adoption in the State budget. The funds were subsequently not approved for this program during the State's budget approval process. As part of the current fiscal budget cycle for the State of California, these 2004-2005 funds have now been appropriated and require a new application and resolution. Staff is therefore seeking approval of the same grant application for \$75,000 to plant trees and shrubs at the entrance to the Lower Arroyo Seco Park. This project will specifically restore 100 native trees and 400 native shrubs to approximately six acres at the southern entrance to the park. In addition, the project provides for irrigation to ensure their long-term viability. The project is identified in the adopted Lower Arroyo Seco Master Plan.

The City of Pasadena has an additional opportunity to apply for grant funding from the California Department of Transportation, Environmental Enhancement and Mitigation Grant Program for the 2006-2007 funding cycle. Staff is seeking the support of the City Council to apply for funding in the amount of \$200,000 for street tree planting and additional habitat restoration in the Lower Arroyo Seco Park consistent with the Master Plan. The grant application calls for planting 600 street trees Citywide that will replace trees that have been lost to disease or weather conditions over the past few years. In addition, like the 2004-2005 grant application, this application calls for native tree plantings and habitat restoration in the Lower Arroyo Seco Park.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The City of Pasadena has been approved to receive \$75,000 to help implement a portion of the Lower Arroyo Seco Master Plan by planting native trees and shrubs, and installing irrigation from the 2004-2005 EEM Grant Program with approval of this application. If the City of Pasadena is successful in obtaining funding for the 2006-2007 funding cycle, the City will receive \$200,000 to be utilized towards diminishing the street tree deficiency and restoring the native wetlands in the southern portion of the Arroyo Seco. Neither of these grants requires matching funds from the City.
