

PROGRAMS, DEPARTMENTS OR GROUPS AFFECTED

PWP will implement the engineering solution developed to solve the electrical distribution issue. The Planning and Development Department may now process, and issue, all development permits sought in the B-7 circuit area.

FISCAL IMPACT

There will not be an immediate fiscal impact as a result of the cancellation of the temporary moratorium. PWP staff will report on the fiscal impact of the engineering solution developed to solve the electrical supply issue.


ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION



ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PASADENA REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 7059, THE INTERIM URGENCY ORDINANCE TEMPORARILY PROHIBITING THE ISSUANCE OF BUILDING, MECHANICAL, AND ELECTRICAL PERMITS IN THE B-7 ELECTRIC CIRCUIT AREA OF THE CITY

WHEREAS, on June 26, 2006, the City Council adopted an Interim Urgency Ordinance of the City of Pasadena Temporarily Prohibiting the Issuance of Building, Mechanical, and Electrical Permits in the B-7 Circuit Area of the City; and

WHEREAS, on August 7, 2006, the City adopted an Extension of the Interim Urgency Ordinance of the City of Pasadena Temporarily Prohibiting the Issuance of Building, Mechanical, and Electrical Permits in the B-7 Circuit Area of the City, which extended the moratorium for an additional ten months and 15 days from August 7, 2006 ; and

WHEREAS, the need for the moratorium arose out of the Water and Power Department's conclusion that further addition of new electrical loads in the form of new construction, or renovations and upgrades to current structures, could jeopardize the integrity of the B-7 circuit and cause outages and unreliable electrical service in the area; and

WHEREAS, during the effective period of the moratorium, the Water and Power Department continued its analysis of the electrical distribution system, and in particular the B-7 circuit, and implemented a solution, as set forth in the staff report submitted herewith; and

WHEREAS, the City now desires to repeal the moratorium prior to its previously set cancellation date.

NOW THEREFORE, the People of the City of Pasadena ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 7059, the Interim Urgency Ordinance of the City of Pasadena Temporarily Prohibiting the Issuance of Building, Mechanical, and Electrical Permits in the B-7 Circuit Area of the City, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. The City Clerk shall certify the adoption of this ordinance and shall cause this ordinance to be published in full.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon publication.


