SUBJECT: PUBLIC HEARING: APPROVAL OF THE ANNUAL ACTION PLAN (2008-

2009) AS THE APPLICATION AND STATEMENT OF PROJECTED USE OF

FUNDS FOR THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT ("HUD") COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT, EMERGENCY SHELTER GRANT; HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIP ACT. AND CERTAIN RELATED HUMAN SERVICES ENDOWMENT FUND

**ALLOCATIONS** 

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 1. It is recommended that upon the close of the public hearing the City Council adopt a resolution:
  - (a) Approving the 2008-2009 Annual Action Plan as an application for participation in the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) and Home Investment Partnership Act (HOME) programs including the identified proposed projects/activities of the City's Human Services Endowment Fund (HSEF);
  - (b) Approving an application for CDBG Entitlement in the amount of \$2,204,222; the allocation of CDBG current year program income of \$200,000; the allocation of CDBG 2006-2007 reprogrammed funds of \$56,602; approving an application for ESG funds in the amount of \$97,516; an application for HOME Entitlement in the amount of \$1,172,269; the allocation of HOME current year program income of \$790,921;
  - (c) Authorizing the City Manager to execute, and the City Clerk to attest, the Annual Action Plan, the grant agreements, the sub-recipient agreements, and any and all other documents deemed necessary by HUD to obtain the allocation of the aforementioned federal CDBG/ESG/HOME funds in a manner acceptable to the City Attorney;
  - (d) Approving an annual allocation from the City of Pasadena's HSEF of \$123,980.

- 2. It is recommended that the City Council:
  - (a) Appropriate \$98,117 from the Inclusionary Housing Trust Fund as the required local match to the HUD ESG allocation; and
  - (b) Authorize the City Manager to execute, and the City Clerk to attest, the agreements with the approved recipients/sub-recipients in a form acceptable to the City Attorney (Exhibits A, B, & D).

#### **ADVISORY BODIES RECOMMENDATIONS**

The Northwest Commission recommended City Council approval of the proposed Non-Public Service projects at it regular meeting on May 14, 2008 (Exhibit A).

The Human Services Commission ("HSC") recommended City Council approval of the Public/Human Service projects at a special meeting on March 26, 2008 (Exhibit B). At its regular meeting of April 9, 2008, the HSC heard public comments/oral appeals funding recommendations. While no funding recommendations were revised at the meeting, the "HSC" recommended that should additional funding become available to the City to address unmet human service needs for July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2010, the following four projects that applied in the CDBG (15% public/human services), ESG and HSEF process be prioritized for funding consideration:

- In the Food & Nutrition Category: additional funding to Foothill Unity Center's *Nutrition Assistance Project* (to augment the funding recommendation of \$50,000; the proposal requested \$94,500)
- In the Education Category: Child Care Information Services' Pasadena Collaborative Literacy Project and El Centro de Accion Social Inc.'s Youth Education Programs
- In the Health Care Services Category, Community Health Alliance Program's Healthy Smiles, Brighter Futures Project.

#### BACKGROUND:

#### Annual Action Plan (2008-2009)

The Annual Action Plan sets forth the projected use of the subject funds for the coming year and activities to be undertaken, program guidelines, and monitoring. The Annual Action Plan addresses the goals/objectives as outlined in the City's Strategic Plan included in the City's Five Year Consolidated Plan (2005-2010).

#### Program Priorities and Project Selection Process

Projects recommended for funding by the Northwest and Human Services Commissions were selected through an extensive competitive review process. Both Commissions

performed a review of current socio-economic data and garnered public input to develop the 2008-2009 program priorities. On September 12, 2007 the Human Services Commission recommended public/human services program priorities as follows: Community Violence and Safety; Education; Employment and Training; Food and Nutrition Programs; Health Care Services; Homeless Prevention and Intervention; and Services for Youth and Young Adults. On October 11, 2007, the Northwest Commission recommended non-public services program priorities as follows: Housing; Economic Development; Code Enforcement; Public Facilities and Improvements; and Planning and Administration. On November 5, 2007 the City Council approved these priorities and they were included in the CDBG, ESG and HSEF 2008 – 2009 Request for Proposals (RFP) released in November 2007. The availability of the RFP was widely publicized in the community. To assist potential applicants, four RFP workshops were conducted and additional technical assistance was provided to applicants who so requested it. The deadline for submission of the proposals was January 11, 2008.

In total, 38 proposals were submitted, of which 36 were judged to be responsive. Of these, 31 were public/human services projects and 5 were non-public services projects. All proposals were reviewed and rated by both staff and members of the applicable commission using the criteria set forth in the RFP.

Approval of the Annual Action Plan also enables the City to be eligible for other federally funded programs requiring consistency with an adopted Five Year Consolidated Plan/Annual Action Plan.

The following federal/local funding sources totaling \$4,743,627 are available for allocation to sub-recipients for the provision of proposed project services/activities identified in the attached exhibits and in the chart below:

The proposed allocation of CDBG/ESG/HSEF 2008-2009 Program Year funds are consistent with the needs assessment and program funding priorities approved by City Council on November 5, 2007.

The HOME funds totaling \$1,963,190 (\$1,172,269 entitlement and \$790,921 program income) are proposed to be allocated by the program categories as identified in Exhibit "C", are to be allocated in the following program categories: American Community Fund Reserves (Fannie Mae); \$558,000; Emergency Rental Assistance Deposit (ERAD) \$85,000; HOME Tenant-Based Rental Assistance Program (TBRA) \$270,000; Homeownership Opportunities Program (HOP) \$405,278; Housing Production \$385,643; and Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO) \$175,832. The ERAD, TBRA and HOP programs are designed to help very low and low income individual households with rent, security deposits and down payment assistance. A Notice of Funding Available (NOFA) will be released to seek eligible CHDOs to provide services in Pasadena.

At its regular meeting of May 19, 2008, City Council approved the City Set-Aside allocation of CDBG funds in the amount of \$1,762,057 (Exhibit "D"). Of this total, \$874,000 are allocated to three eligible City administered non-public service projects and \$888,057 for debt service on community economic development loans and CDBG Program Administration.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

Approval of the Annual Action Plan by the City Council and subsequent approval by HUD will provide revenues totaling \$4,743,627 (\$4,521,530 federal and \$222,097 local) for housing/community development activities:
