CUR ICCT. Authorization to Enter into a Contract

SUBJECT: Authorization to Enter into a Contract with First Transit for the Operation of

the Pasadena Area Rapid Transit System (ARTS) and Pasadena Dial-A-Ride

from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2014.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the City Council authorize the execution of a contract with First Transit to operate the Pasadena Area Rapid Transit System (ARTS) and Pasadena Dial-A-Ride for a period up to five years from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2014 for an amount not to exceed \$24,344,198 for direct contract services and \$25,000 for contingency expenses (\$5,000 annually). The detail of the contract rates is shown in Attachment 1. Competitive bidding is not required pursuant to City Charter Section 1002 (F) Contracts for Professional or Unique Services.

#### BACKGROUND:

The Department of Transportation issued a Request for Proposals to provide fixed route (Pasadena ARTS) and dial-a-ride service in Pasadena in early September 2008. The Department received two proposals. The Department anticipated bringing a report to the City Council in November for award of contract which covers a multi-year period. In November 2008, a report to City Council requested a two month extension of the contract to allow the Department to work through issues addressed below. The City Council approved the extension; however, the issues were not resolved and in January 2009 the Department requested additional time to resolve the issues.

The Department has worked with the City Manager's office and Finance Department to develop a plan to ensure funding for the Pasadena ARTS and Dial-A-Ride services. This Fiscal Year 2010 proposed budget for the two programs includes this plan.

The Department has worked with the two companies that submitted proposals, First Transit and Southland Transit to restructure their proposals to fit the current revenue constraints. The current proposals from the two companies have been evaluated and the Department of Transportation is recommending that First Transit be selected. The selection of First Transit is also supported by the evaluation conducted by a panel consisting of four City employees and two transportation professionals from outside

organizations. The City staff included a member from the Purchasing Division and three members of the Department of Transportation's Transit Division, the Transit Manager, Senior Planner and Management Analyst. The outside members included the General Manager for Metro's Westside/Central Division who has oversight of Metro's contracts; and a Senior Transportation Analyst with the City of Irvine who has extensive experience in transit contract management. The panel recommended the selection of First Transit. The panel scored First Transit 81 out of 100 points and Southland 68 out of 100 points.

The difference in the contract pricing for the two companies, First Transit and Southland Transit, is shown in the Table below. See Attachment 2 for a comparison of hourly rates among other fixed route transit service providers in our local market area.
