SUBJECT: AUTHORIZATION TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH FEHR AND PEERS TO DEVELOP A TRAVEL DEMAND MODEL TO SUPPORT THE UPDATES OF GENERAL PLAN LAND USE AND MOBILITY ELEMENTS FOR A NOT TO EXCEED AMOUNT OF

\$149,300

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract with Fehr and Peers to develop a travel demand model for the City of Pasadena to be used as a tool in the evaluation of the General Plan Land Use and Mobility Element Updates for an amount not to exceed \$149,300.

BACKGROUND:

The Department of Transportation circulated a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) seeking proposals from qualified contractors to develop a travel demand forecasting model to support an update of the General Plan Land Use and Mobility Elements. The department was seeking a contractor with both the technical expertise and innovative approach that will be needed to develop and apply a model that will support the adopted Mobility Element goals that call for the City to:

- Promote a livable community
- Encourage non-auto travel
- Protect neighborhoods by discouraging traffic from intruding into community neighborhoods
- Manage multi-modal corridors to promote and improve citywide transportation services.

In light of these goals, the focus on sustainability that has emerged as a City priority since adoption of the 2004 General Plan elements, and recent State legislation relating to climate change and sustainability (AB 32 and SB 375), this will not be a standard exercise in travel demand modeling. The focus of the travel demand model will be supporting General Plan goals while responding to emerging requirements regarding greenhouse gas emissions. The selected modeling approach must therefore offer sensitivity to fine-grained changes in land use, urban design features and transportation demand strategies.

Fifteen firms received the RFQ. Four firms responded and were evaluated by staff using the criteria set forth in the RFQ. Based on the evaluation committee's initial review and ranking of the four proposals, all four firms were invited to interviews with the staff evaluation committee. The interviews focused on each team's qualifications and relevant prior experience in preparing travel demand models. The ranking criteria and evaluation committee scores are attached. Based on the evaluation, which is summarized in Attachment A, Fehr and Peers was determined to be best qualified to perform the needed services. The travel demand model will be developed over the next several months and will be ready to support the Land Use and Mobility Element analysis.

Key elements of the travel demand model that Fehr and Peers will produce include:

- The evaluation of the Land Use and Mobility Element land use scenarios and transportation system;
- The ability to evaluate transportation system network and modal alternatives;
- Provide information regarding regional pass-through versus locallygenerated traffic on City streets;
- Produce graphical displays of the results and;
- Estimate the effectiveness of various Land Use and Mobility Element policies on the transportation system.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Sufficient funding for the travel demand model contract is included in the Department of Transportation's FY2009 Operating Budget.
