Jose,
As discussed yesterday, the following are concerns T-Mobile has with the proposed amendments in priority:

1. 4 " Bracket - A 4" bracket will not work with flush mounted antennas on a utility pole as it will not allow for enough down-tilt on the antenna (needed to propagate the signal). This should be revised to at least 6 ".
2. Locate only on poles less than $25^{\prime}$ high $-99 \%$ of the utility poles that are available (per JPA and GO-94 \& 95 regulations) are guide poles. These poles are almost always less than $25^{\prime}$. Therefore, the new amendments will make it almost impossible too find a site in the right-of-way.
3. Antennas can only be placed 7' above the primary use - Due to the amount of trees found in Pasadena, especially in residential areas, this will not be enough height to place the antennas over the trees. If this requirement must remain then it should only apply to light standards.
4. If located adjacent to a corner lot, then the site must be placed on the side-yard - Please add a provision that allows us to obtain an exception if it is less intrusive in the front yard or we obtain permission from the property owner.

As discussed, if the ordinance is passed as-is, then the current three projects we have will be killed. I just want to ensure that the City is passing an ordinance that will actually be feasible for the industry it's attempting to regulate.

Tim Miller will be at the City Council on Monday to address these concerns as well. Thanks for taking the time to meet with me yesterday.
