I just spoke with Jackie McIntyre, since I live on the South side of the freeway in the Playhouse area of the Central Business District, and there is a slice of this residential community that is still in Chris Holden's district even though the freeway cut through. Jackie said the handbill ordinance is not on Monday's agenda and to call 744-4124 every Thursday morning to find out what items are on the following Monday's City Council agenda. When I called that number the lady who answered the phone said to call Cathy Vanderborg, the Assistant City Clerk at 744-7398 and I am waiting for her return call.

Since I am also concerned about the cell phone towers I told Jackie about the magazine the Pasadena Visitors and Convention Bureau is giving out to people which has a current article about the dangers of cell phones and cell phone towers. The magazine is called Lookin' Green Environmental Issues & Impact Special Edition 2009 Volume 1 Issue 200903. The health risks are exposed and the quotes are from Dr. Vini Khurana, Respected Australian Neurosurgeon, Dr. Keith Black, Head of Neurosurgery, Cedars-Sinai Hospital, Dr. Robert O Becker, medical researcher expert on electromagnetic radiation, author and twice Nobel Prize nominee, and Dr. George Carlo, one of the world's leading experts on electro-pollution. Jackie said there is a state law that the city cannot block the cell phone companies from putting up cell towers and to again

call the city clerk's number 744-4124 to find out the name of the state bill and how to get a copy of it. This is important to Liberty and Freedom for all as in the Pledge of Allegiance because as the article states "Hundreds of studies have shown harmful effects of EMF on the immune system, nervous system, learning, moods, and behavioral patterns." The article says Dr. Khurana says "Cell phones are more dangerous than smoking and asbestos." The article says Dr. Black says, "We do not have enough data now to estimate the long-term ill effects" and the article says Dr. Becker says, "the greatest polluting element in the earth's environment is the proliferation of electromagnetic fields. I consider this to be far greater on a global scale, than warming, and the increase in chemical elements in the environment." Whew. What a statement from twice Nobel Prize nominee!!

The article says Dr. Carlo says, "The combined effects of electro-pollution...are the most serious health risk we have ever faced...Electro-pollution makes the population more susceptible and vulnerable to other environmental assaults such as air and water pollution, poor nutrition, exposure to viruses and bacteria, as well as physical stressors such as extreme heat and cold, and stressful life events." Also last month I read four other articles in health magazines exposing the health dangers. So what about life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. No wonder the health costs in America are so high, we are being bombarded with these electro-magnetic frequencies of the electro-magnetic TOWERS.

These plus the 40-year water deprivation ordinance are prime concerns to residents now that the tree issue has been dealt with. If you have guest speakers and if I get the permit to use the Library for community dialogue, please help me get the residents' discussion out on the table. The 60,000 apartment renters are also affected by these things, not just the home buyers, and they are isolated. Stacking and packing people into apartments disconnects them from the residents in the suburbs who have Neighborhood Associations they can join and talk matters over. I can't do this alone I need your help please. Thank you.

Everything going on is a bit overwhelming but people can join hands together and if we each do our little parts then perhaps the apathy and fear can start to melt? The Constitution is the way to run the county, not the whims of the big money that states and cities get from setting in motion ordinances and bills that are hard to reverse. The nation's health catastrophe could be averted if government from the top down and the bottom up better interpreted how the Constitution is written to apply. Where does all this power to harm the populace come from? Do we elect these officials to hurt us? Do we elect government to act like it owns the people in the private sector? Of course we don't. So if we don't voice disapproval when they run roughshod over the health and happiness of the residents, then the check and balance system between profitability and community has become lopsided. Moving future business forward by meeting monetary quotas without concern for the health risks is something other than the government keeping a win-win situation with the residents whose lives are affected by all the pollution and greed.
