SUBJECT:

AUTHORIZE PURCHASE ORDER WITH WONDRIES FLEET GROUP

FOR PURCHASE OF EIGHT NEW REPLACEMENT POLICE VEHICLES

FOR A TOTAL OF \$194,460

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

- Find that this action is exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines 1) Section 15061 (b) (3), the General Rule that CEQA only applies to projects that may have an affect on the environment.;
- 2) Authorize the issuance of a purchase order to Wondries Fleet Group in an amount not to exceed \$194,460 for the purchase of eight new replacement Police Vehicles; (Competitive bidding is not required pursuant to City Charter section 1002(H), contracts with other governmental entities or their contractors for labor, material, supplies or services; and
- 3) Grant the proposed contract an exemption from the competitive selection process of the Competitive Bidding and Purchasing Ordinance pursuant to Pasadena Municipal Code Section 4.08.048 (B), Contracts for which the City's best interest are served; and

BACKGROUND:

Police patrol vehicles are in service 24 hours a day, seven days a week and because of the duty cycles require high maintenance. The City has established a three year replacement schedule for these vehicles. The sedans identified for replacement have maintenance issues that need to be addressed; namely, suspension wear and loss of power in the drive trains which are immediate safety hazards. This vehicle purchase request eliminates any unnecessary spending on these vehicles for maintenance and repairs. The vehicle replacement/ condition reports are attached.

The Police Department requires specialized vehicles designed to handle the demands of the job and built to protect drivers. Staff has specifications for a dedicated heavy-duty

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police package including bullet proof door panels, heavy duty suspension and heavy duty transmission, power steering and engine oil cooling. The proposed purchase of eight sedans will replace vehicles that will meet or exceed the 100,000 mile threshold and have exceeded their useful three year life cycles.

The County of Los Angeles currently has a purchase order in place with Wondries Fleet Group #PO-SH-10322067-1 dated February 11, 2010, for the purchase of Crown Victoria Police Interceptors. Wondries Fleet Group has offered to extend this contract price to the City of Pasadena for eight police interceptors due for replacement in FY2011. Purchasing the requested vehicles from Wondries Fleet Group would be in the City's best interest because it would expedite the delivery of the vehicles, thus reducing the time needed to place the vehicles in service; it will also save the City at least \$695 per vehicle in price increases for model year 2011 for a total savings of \$5,560.

COUNCIL POLICY CONSIDERATION:

By providing the Police Department the proper equipment to perform its function the proposed purchase furthers the City Council's Strategic Plan goal to ensure Public Safety. Additionally, this purchase supports the City of Pasadena's adoption of the United Nations Urban Environmental Accords (UEA) action 14: Phase down sulfur levels in diesel and gasoline fuels, use advanced emission controls on all public fleets to reduce particulate matter and smog-forming emissions by 50% by the year 2012.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT:

This purchase complies with all South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) rules and regulations for engine emissions and clean air standards in the South Coast basin.

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FISCAL IMPACT:

This equipment is a budgeted replacement, and funds in the amount of \$194,460 are available in the Equipment Replacement Fund (budget account 766300).
