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PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

Councilmember Holden returned at 7:04 p.m.

Councilmember Madison, Chair of the Public Safety Committee, introduced the agenda item.

Fire Chief Calvin Wells provided background information for the independent study (performed by Citygate Associates) of the Department's standards of coverage for the delivery of services that has been recently completed, clarified the City's deployment system as it pertains to determining the appropriate medical assistance and transport that is to be provided when a 9-1-1 call is received, and responded to questions.

Deputy Fire Chief Kevin Costa reviewed the "Fire Department Station Location Study" as part of a PowerPoint presentation, and responded to questions.

The City Manager commented on staff's assessment of providing 8 fire stations to meet the City's coverage needs, the rationale for a 2 vs. 3 truck company system, and factors in considering possible future relocation of Fire Station 32 to the former Shakey's location; and responded to questions.

Councilmember Gordo expressed concerns regarding the need for the City Council to hold a future discussion of the City's deployment system and factors to be considered in how to "right size" emergency medical calls for service in terms of determining the appropriate medical assistance and transport that is to be provided when a 9-1-1 call is received.

On order of the Mayor, the information was received and filed.

LaRonda Hartfield, Los Angeles resident, expressed concerns regarding the lack of adequate housing, shelter space, and jobs to address issues facing the homeless community, and asked for the City's help in addressing the homeless community's needs.
