SUBJECT:

ADOPTION OF GANN APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the City Council:

- 1. Adopt a resolution that:
  - Selects the California per capita income and the population increase for the City of Pasadena as the indices to be used in calculating the appropriations limit for Fiscal Year 2014; and
  - b) Establishes the appropriations limit for Fiscal Year 2014 at \$244,480,005; and
  - c) Establishes appropriations subject to the limit for Fiscal Year 2014 at \$104,201,051.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

An annual appropriations limit established by City Council resolution is required as a result of the 1979 Proposition 4, Gann Initiative, Article XIIIB of the State Constitution, Section 7910 of the Government Code as implemented by Senate Bill 1352. On May 23, 2013, a legal notice was published announcing the City Council's consideration of this item and stating that the calculations made to arrive at the appropriations limit are available for review in the Finance Department.

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2014 appropriations limit was calculated, per the League of California Cities Uniform Guidelines, by applying the population and inflation factors to the prior year limit. The City of Pasadena population change is 0.52 percent. Per the California State Department of Finance, the year-over-year change in personal income was 5.12 percent, resulting in an increase to the City's appropriation limit from \$231.4 million in FY 2013 to \$244.2 million for FY 2014.

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The appropriations limit is applied only to those expenses funded through tax proceeds. The limit is further reduced by any expenditures for debt service or capital; therefore, the appropriations subject to the limit in the City's FY 2014 budget are \$104.2 million.

The City's budget is \$140.3 million under the calculated appropriations limit.

#### **COUNCIL POLICY CONSIDERATION:**

The City Council's strategic planning goal of maintaining fiscal responsibility and stability will be advanced through the review and adoption of the Gann appropriations limit for FY 2014.

#### **RESOLUTION NO.**

## A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PASADENA ESTABLISHING THE APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014

WHEREAS, Article XIIIB of the California Constitution and Section 7910 of the California Government Code require the governing body of each local jurisdiction to establish, by Resolution, an appropriations limit for the following fiscal year at a regularly scheduled meeting or noticed special meeting; and

**WHEREAS**, Government Code Section 7910 requires that, fifteen (15) days prior to such meeting, documentation used in the determination of the appropriations limit and other necessary determinations shall be available to the public, and such information was made available in this manner;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Pasadena that:

- (1) the California Per Capita Income and the population increase for the City of Pasadena are selected as the indices to be used for calculating the Appropriations Limit for Fiscal Year 2014; and
- (2) the Appropriations Limit for Fiscal Year 2014 is established at \$244,480,005; and
- (3) the Appropriations Subject to the Limit for Fiscal Year 2014 are established at \$104,201,051.
