I am the President of the Hispanic American Airborne Association (HAAA) - Los Angeles chapter. I have served in the United States Army's 101st Airborne Division from 1960 to 1966. The HAAA has chapters throughout Southern California ranging from Coachella Valley to San Diego. The Los Angeles chapter encompasses the San Gabriel Valley, to include Pasadena. We are veterans that have served in the Airborne units of all branches of the United States Armed Forces. In our chapter alone, we have over 500 members. Many members of the HAAA, including myself, reside in Pasadena.

As an association, we recognize that a genocide occurred against the Armenian people, during World War I by the Ottoman Turkish government. As a result, over 1.5 million Armenian men, women and children were systematically slaughtered by their hands. The HAAA solemnly supports the Armenian Genocide Memorial and its location in Memorial Park, Pasadena. It is a fitting location, to where people of all ethnicities can come to reflect, meditate, hope and pray that atrocities of this magnitude never occur again against humanity.

Dear Council,


I am writing this letter regarding the plans to place a memorial to the Armenian Genocide at Memorial Park in Pasadena. It recently was brought to my attention that there are some concerned individuals who do not believe Memorial Park is the proper venue for such a monument. Their argument is that the park is meant to only honor the men and women of America's military forces, and that a monument to a foreign genocide would infringe on such a purpose.

While I am no authority on what function Memorial Park serves, I can speak about my own beliefs and opinions. Having been born and raised in the beautiful city of Pasadena, I feel the need to voice my position on such a significant matter. As someone who spent six years in the Marine Corps, and had the privilege to serve in Iraq with some of the bravest men and women I have ever known, I must say that I am not offended at all with the placement of a genocide monument in Memorial Park. While I understand the concern of those who oppose the location of the monument, their opinion does not reflect my own, nor do they speak for me.

As a grandson and great grandson of survivors of the Armenian Genocide, the impact of that horrific event was the catalyst which motivated my enlistment into the Marine Corps. I knew then, as I know now, that there is an individual responsibility among citizens of a free nation to do their part in maintaining that freedom, and protecting liberty from those who wish to oppress and tyrannize. To overlook such aspects of history in the name of honoring veterans is disrespectful to those same veterans, as it attempts to sanitize history and choose which events to remember.

I sincerely hope the right decision is made, and Pasadena's rich history of tolerance and community is continued.

We would like to thank you and city staff for the thoughtfulness in vetting the proposed Armenian Genocide Memorial project. We support staff's recommendation to **approve the Armenian Genocide Memorial in Memorial Park** for the following three reasons:

1. Accomplishes Key Objectives in Master Plan

- The proposed memorial is consistent with the Memorial Park Master Plan, which doesn't limit memorials to US war veterans/organizations.
- The proposed memorial enhances Memorial Park by accomplishing key objectives in the Master Plan (excerpts):
 - Make Memorial Park memorable. "There needs to be one or two elements in the park that are strong enough to be carried around in our minds."
 - Dramatize Memorial Park's natural features. "Memorial Park's strong natural features should be made even more powerful, thus connecting Pasadenans to a piece of nature."
 - Make Memorial Park accessible. "Presently, Memorial Park is blocked visually, physically and psychologically. In order to create an alive, cared-for park, these barriers must be altered and connections made between the park and its potential constituents."
- The proposed memorial meets the Public Park and Recreational Facility Park Monument Policy.

2. Improves Unused Area


- The proposed memorial connects "dead" north-west part of Memorial Park to the rest of the park.
- The proposed memorial enlivens an area made vacant by trees lost in the wind storm.
- The proposed memorial will bring new visitors to an underutilized park.

3. Harmonizes with Surroundings

- The proposed memorial design is understated, reverent, and powerful.
- The proposed memorial fits into the current serene ambiance of the park.
- The proposed memorial scale is well balanced among the mature vegetation.

On September 9th, the Pasadena City Council will hear a recommendation to place a memorial to the 1.5 million victims of the Armenian Genocide in Memorial Park. The Pasadena Armenian Genocide Memorial Committee has worked tirelessly with both the community and the city to design a fitting memorial. Further, with the cooperation of city staff, we have found a beautiful corner of Memorial Park in which to place that memorial.

I am writing to urge you to support that recommendation. The design submitted for your consideration, besides being a truly artistic masterpiece, captures the spirit of those victims of the first genocide of the twentieth century. Many of those survivors came to Pasadena in the aftermath of that horror. The Armenian community has been a critical part of Pasadena since those first survivors arrived. I am proud to be descended from that community just as I am proud to have been given the opportunity to serve as your chief of police for thirteen years. I am equally proud to have served for twenty eight years in the military reserve including three tours of active duty, one in a combat theatre.

Among the survivors of that genocide was a young boy who lost his mother, four brothers and sisters. His father, held in slave labor, survived, but the boy never saw him again. That boy came here with his aunt and uncle, attended PHS & PCC before graduating from Occidental college. He had a career that included being a professor of speech at the University of Tulsa and worked as an executive for Douglas Aircraft. He raised four children and, along with the only parents he ever knew, went to his final rest at Mountain View cemetery in Altadena.

That man was my father. It is to honor his memory and that of my grandparents, both the ones I knew and the ones I only heard about, that I have involved myself in this project. It seems imperative to ensure that all of Pasadena learn about this event and remember that the unthinkable can happen. That is why I support this memorial both in design and location.

In early 1942, Adolph Hitler and the leaders of Germany's Nazi government gathered to plan the final extermination of the Jewish people. When asked about whether he was concerned about world opinion, he is quoted as saying; "Who today speaks of the Armenians?" Even today very few people today speak of the Armenian Genocide because it is seldom acknowledged. This memorial will serve not only as a remembrance of the past, but as a beacon for the future generations to ensure that they do not forget, not just the Armenians, but all victims of injustice.
