## AUTHORIZATION TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH MATHESON FOR THE FURNISHING AND DELIVERY OF CALIBRATION AND INDUSTRIAL GASES FOR THE BROADWAY AND GLENARM POWER PLANTS Recommendation:

(1) Find that contracting with Matheson for the furnishing and delivery of calibration and industrial gases for the Broadway and Glenarm Power Plants is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301, Existing Facilities;

Kelvin Parker, Principal Planner, presented a PowerPoint presentation summarizing the proposed project, and responded to questions.

The City Clerk reported that one letter from the project applicant was received by the City Clerk's Office and distributed to the City Council opposing the call for review.

Councilmember Tornek provided information regarding the need to call this matter for review to the City Council, noted the discretionary nature for approving a non-conforming use, and responded to questions.

The Mayor cited the language in the East Pasadena Specific Plan which allows for the expansion of existing non-confirming uses, and therefore stated his preference to not support the call for review request.

Councilmember McAustin noted that the applicant's project followed the City's process for Minor Conditional Use Permit approvals, is consistent with the current rules in place for that location, and believes that the rules should not be amended in the middle of the process.

Following discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Tornek, seconded by Councilmember Madison, to call for review this matter to the City Council:

Vice Mayor Robinson spoke positively on the "Men Educating Men About Health" event and noted that an honoree at the event was Mrs. Joan Williams, a former City employee, who in 1958 was not allowed to ride on the City's Rose Parade Float (as was the custom at the time) and requested that the City Council, in the near future, acknowledge and extend an apology to Mrs. Williams in an official capacity.

Councilmembers Madison and Kennedy spoke in support of the Vice Mayor's request, with Mr. Kennedy, asking staff to review the history behind Mrs. Williams claim and make the appropriate findings. He also suggested the City could sponsor a float in the 2015 Rose Parade and allow Mrs. Williams to participate by riding on the City's float in the parade.

REPORTS FROM REPRESENTATIVES/ REQUESTS FRO FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS In addition, Mr. Kennedy requested that staff provide information on the free meals program at Villa Park and the program's future goals. He also reiterated his request that the Police Chief's decision to refer officer involved shooting investigations to the Los Angeles Sherif's Department be agenized at a future Council meeting, including a report on the policy considerations that were used to make the decision.
