
Dear city council members,

I am a small restaurant owner in Pasadena. The name of my business is called La Luce and started my business in 2007 serving the community of Pasadena.


I'm extremely concerned that the new food service container and cup ban will harm my business. By switching from foam to an alternative product, it will be paying double or triple what I pay now.

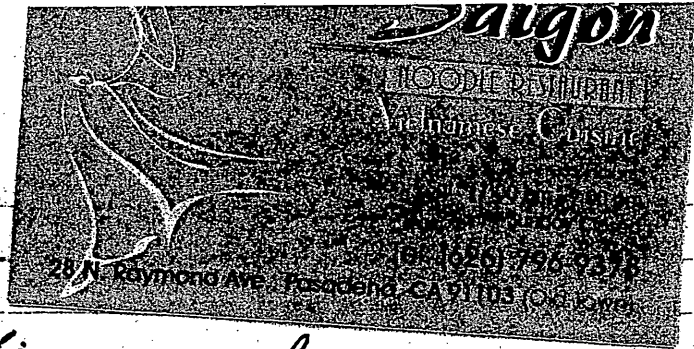
As an Independent small restaurant owner, I know that keeping my prices low is something my customers appreciate & have kept me in business for the last 17 years in Pasadena.
