SUBJECT: CONTRACT AWARD TO DOUG MARTIN CONTRACTING COMPANY, INC. FOR SLURRY SEAL OF STREETS – 2017 FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$486,000

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

1. Find the project herein to be categorically exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines in accordance with Title 14, Chapter 3, Class 1, Section 15301, minor alterations of existing public facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that previously existing at the time of the lead agency's determination; and
2. Accept the bid dated May 24, 2017, submitted by Doug Martin Contracting Company, Inc. in response to the Specifications for the Slurry Seal of Streets – 2017, and authorize the City Manager to enter into such contract for an amount not to exceed \$486,000.

BACKGROUND:

This project consists of the slurry seal of eight miles of City streets, repainting of existing permanent traffic striping, and installation of raised pavement markers as needed. A list of the streets to be slurry sealed and a map showing locations are included as Attachments A and B to this report. A finding of compliance with the General Plan was previously made and is shown on page 2.2 of the adopted FY 2017 Capital Improvement Program (CIP), Resurfacing and Slurry Seal FY 2017/2018.

The Department of Public Works prepared plans and specifications for this project. In accordance with Section 4.08.070 of the Pasadena Municipal Code, bids were requested and received. This project was advertised in the *Pasadena Journal* on May 4, 2017. In addition, the Notice Inviting Bids was published in four trade publications and listed on the City's website, which generated notices to six local vendors. Bid packets were obtained by sixteen contractors, four of whom submitted bids for the project.

Following advertising, bids were received on May 24, 2017, and are as follows:

It is recommended that Doug Martin Contracting Company, Inc. be awarded the contract for this project as they are the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. The proposed contract with Doug Martin Contracting Company, Inc. fully complies with the Competitive Bidding and Living Wage Ordinances. In addition, the proposed contract with Doug Martin Contracting Company, Inc. fully complies with the Prevailing Wage Law (Senate Bill 7) per Resolution 9406 adopted by the City Council on December 15, 2014. The contractor has indicated that the award of this contract will result in no new hires to its present workforce. Doug Martin Contracting Company, Inc. is not currently contracted for other work for the City of Pasadena.

The contract for this project will be set up as follows:

Base Bid	\$ 441,359
Contingency Allowance	\$ 44,641
Contract "Not to Exceed" Amount	\$ 486,000

It is anticipated that construction will begin in August 2017 and be completed in October 2017.

COUNCIL POLICY CONSIDERATION:

This project is consistent with the City Council's goals to improve, maintain and enhance public facilities and infrastructure, and improve mobility and accessibility throughout the City. It also supports the Public Facilities Element of the General Plan by maintaining public facilities to enhance the quality of life of the community.

ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS:

The City's Environmental Administrator recommends that the City Council determine the proposed project to be exempt under CEQA in accordance with Title 14, Chapter 3, Class 1, Section 15301, minor alterations of existing public facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that existing at the time of lead agency's determination.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The total cost of this contract is \$486,000 and the total cost of this action will be \$536,000. Funding for this action will be addressed by the utilization of existing funds in the Resurfacing and Slurry Seal FY 2017/2018 CIP project (budget account 73920). It is anticipated that all of the cost will be spent in FY 2018.


