I am writing to you with an update from the Arts and Culture Commission in support of the Glenarm Power Plant Public Art Project. My fellow commissioners and I are pleased and honored to be part of embracing, supporting and advancing the arts and culture for our fellow citizens of Pasadena.

Specifically regarding the Glenarm Power Plant proposed art project we submit to you the following points:

- There were two public hearings and two council meetings at which the Glenarm Power Plant project was discussed. Four Madison Heights residents spoke at those meetings, (two adults, two students,) addressing their perspectives on Madison Heights' residents lifestyle concerns.
- The Glenarm Power Plant public art project is not the same project as the Art Center South campus plan, and the Art Center South project does not fall under the purview of the Arts and Culture Commission.
- The public art project proposal involves no neon lighting.
- It faces Blair High School and will cover old steam plant buildings.
- The proposed public art project will help create a place-making gateway into Pasadena and is designed by a well-known and accomplished professional, Alice Aycock.
- This project was unanimously voted on by the City of Pasadena Arts and Culture Commission.

I hope these points are useful and convey our unanimous support of the public art project for the Glenarm Power Plant.
