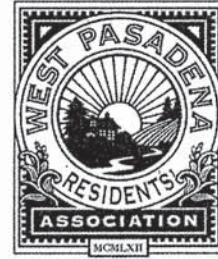

Dear Mayor and Members of the City Council:

On Monday evening, 26 March 2018, you will be reviewing and discussing the Huntington Memorial Hospital Master Plan Amendments. I am writing in support of the Master Plan Amendments, specifically to the changes to the West Annex Building.

Some of you may know that in December 2016, a number of residents spoke at the Planning Commission in opposition to the earlier Master Plan, which included plans for a future 92' building to be located on Pasadena Avenue near California Boulevard. The neighbors voiced their concerns about a large 92' building across the street from a single-family neighborhood. The west side of Pasadena Avenue borders the Markham Place Historic District.

We are very grateful to the Huntington Memorial Hospital for agreeing to meet with the neighbors and to discuss our concerns. An agreement was reached to consider a new design and to build two smaller structures, which would be less intrusive to the neighborhood to the west and to the north. The two new buildings - West Annex A and West Annex B - are more compatible in height and in size with the nearby neighborhood.

Please accept this letter as a vote of support for the Huntington Memorial Hospital Master Plan Amendment.
