It is recommended that City Council:

- Find action not subject to CEQA;
- Appropriate \$200,000 Unappropriated General Fund balance to Parks, Recreation and Community Services FY 20 operating budget;
- 3. Appropriate \$10,000 Unappropriated General Fund balance to the City Manager's Office FY 20 operating budget;



- 4. Authorize City Manager to expend amount not to exceed \$200,000, without Competitive Bidding pursuant to City Charter 1002(F), contracts for professional or unique services, with various Pasadena food pantries & meal programs as described in body of report; &
- 5. Grant proposed expenditure exemption from Competitive Selection process pursuant to P.M.C. Section 4.08.049 (B), contracts for which City's best interests served

Background

Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department

\$150K Allocated to date:

- > \$105,400 PUSD family weekend lunches
- > \$10,000 Pasadena Senior Center
- \$34,600 (\$11,533 each) to Friends in Deed, Foothill Unity Center & Salvation Army

Add'I \$10,000 to NDLON



Fund food/meal programs for 3 months

- Food Banks & Pantries
 - To best leverage City resources, work with Pasadena's food banks & pantries which are partners with LA Regional Food Bank
 - Allocate \$71.5K and assign City staff to assist at 7 agencies:

- First African Methodist Episcopal Church
- First Church of the Nazarene
- Foothill Unity Center
- Morning Star Outreach Ministry
- Salvation Army
- St. Andrews Church
- Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church

- 7 nutritionall balance, low-sodium frozen meals, whole fruit, milk & bread
