While I am aware that Governor Newsom believes Filming to be a necessary activity, the City of Pasadena has the right to choose for itself and be more restrictive if it deems doing so is in the best interest of its citizens.

Pasadena's residential neighborhoods are filled with school children trying to focus on what is already challenging online learning. Having them woken up early to filming trucks and crews in their neighborhoods is a disservice to our children.
