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Honorable Councilmembers,

Thousands of hard-working hospitality workers, including many Pasadena residents, have lost their jobs. These extremely difficult circumstances and economic uncertainty are greatly exacerbated when workers do not have a commitment that they will be able to return to their jobs when business conditions improve. That is the experience of long-time workers at the Langham Huntington Hotel here in Pasadena.

After suspending operations of the hotel on April 8th, management of the Langham Huntington sent letters to workers at the end of May saying they "made the difficult decision to permanently separate" with the workers, terminating their employment as of May 28th. Despite the workers' contributions to the hotel, the company did not make any commitment to recall them when business resumes.

After 9/11, the City of Santa Monica passed a right of recall policy to ensure that hotel workers displaced by the economic impact of 9/11 would return to work. Glendale, the City of Long Beach, and the County of Los Angeles recently passed similar policies to deal with the economic insecurity wrought by the COVID-19 pandemic.
