Pasadena's housekeepers, cooks and dishwashers built our city's hotel industry through their backbreaking work, and now these low-wage workers are among the hardest hit by the COVID-19 crisis. Glendale, the City and County of Los Angeles, and Long Beach have done the right thing and passed common sense policies that will ensure hotel workers a right to return to their same jobs when business returns.

After suspending operations of the hotel on April 8th, management of the Langham Huntington sent letters to workers at the end of May saying they "made the difficult decision to permanently separate" with the workers, terminating their employment as of May 28th. Despite the workers' contributions to the hotel, the company did not make any commitment to recall them when business resumes.
