## Recommendations

## Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department

It is recommended that the City Council:

1. Find action exempt under CEQA;
2. Appropriate $\$ 430,865$ to PRCS operating budget \& authorize staff to make adjustments should $100 \%$ reimbursement not occur, to cover Great Plates Delivered expenses October 10 November 8, 2020;
3. Determine if Pasadena should continue participation in Great Plates Delivered, and if so, consider a maximum 3 additional months until February 7, 2021; \&
4. Grant proposed expenditure exemption from Competitive Selection process pursuant to P.M.C. Section 4.08.049(8), contracts for which City's best interests are served.

- Great Plates Delivered Program
> Launched by Governor Newsom in late April
> Program Objectives
- Deliver meals to older adults at risk \& unable to access meals
- Provide economic stimulus to restaurants
- Administered by Cal OES
> FEMA authorizes funding month-to-month
- Program Costs eligible for reimbursement
> FEMA 75.00\%
> State 18.75\%
> City $6.25 \%$ (if fully reimbursed)

- Should Pasadena conclude or modify program, options include:

1. LA County Great Plates Delivered Program
2. SGV YWCA frozen meal delivery
3. \$1.2M CDBG-CV funding to food banks/pantries (becomes available midJanuary 2021)

## Potential Reduction in Service Level

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> Options include:

1. Provide 2, rather than 3, meals/day

- Would reduce monthly cost to $\$ 310 \mathrm{~K}$

2. Eliminate weekend meals

- Would reduce monthly cost to $\$ 341 \mathrm{~K}$
- Currently utilizing 21 local restaurants
- Restaurants attribute employment of 110 staff to Great Plates participation
- 3 restaurants report reopening \& rehiring 15 employees
- 3 restaurants report would have closed if not for Great Plates

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- Great Plates expenses eligible for FEMA \& State reimbursement, but not guaranteed
- Recent Finance Committee discussion, staff recommended further draws on General Fund reserves be only for most critical needs
> Unassigned reserve is depleted
> 5\% General Fund Operating Reserve balance down to \$1.7M (from \$13.8M)
- \$430,865 appropriation expected to come from: FEMA $(\$ 323,149)$; Cal OES $(\$ 72,170)$ \& General Fund $(\$ 35,546)$
- If reimbursement not received, funding will come from Unassigned General Fund balance or Operating Reserve
- If we continue in program, staff will return to appropriate additional funding
