- \$500K one-time appropriation PRCS to increase support for youth job training & readiness programs in FY21
- Implementation of expanded program hampered by COVID-19
- Interns can now work anytime during FY year rather than just summer

Current ROSE Program

- Interns work 125 hours, earn \$1,500
- Qualifications:
 - > Pasadena resident
 - > ages14-24
 - > 2.0+ GPA (if in high school)
 - > SSN or ITIN
 - > California or school ID
 - > Background check and health screening
 - > Household income at or below HUD "Low Income"

ROSE Program Expansion

- \$500K one-time funding to add program components
 - > Develop more internships & opportunities for participants to gain professional skill sets
 - > Partnerships with organizations that provide youth & workforce development programs

PRCS will award grants for:

Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department

Certificate Programs

 Automotive technology, cosmetology, medical & dental assisting, construction & hospitality

Add'l public & private sector internships

 Education, child development, event management, health care, retail, manufacturing & technology

PRCS will award grants for:

Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department

Support for PUSD academies

Internships, college counseling, field trips, technology, equipment & scholarships

Workforce & career development programs
Mentoring, leadership development, training, internships & field trips

PRCS will award grants for:

- Post-ROSE employment services
 - > Resume building, mock interviews, job application & employment search assistance, & career advising
- Job shadowing and site visits

Eligibility for Funding

- All funds for direct support (no admin costs)
- Application process to award grants
- Eligibility:
 - > Pasadena-based nonprofits
 - > Educational institutions
 - > Independent contractors
 - > City departments



- \$500K in FY 2021 PRCS operating budget
- Funds not spent in FY 2021 will be requested to be reappropriated in FY 2022
