PLAN CONFERENCE WITH CONSULTANT ON CIVIC CENTER

Edward H. Bennett of Chicago to Be Here For Meetings With Boards and Architects On Buildings During This Week

Conferences of the greatest importance with regard to the civic center project will be held during the present week when Edward H. Bennett of Chicago, head of the city planning consultants, arrives in Pasadena. Mr. Bennett, who is the senior member of the firm of Bennett, Parsons, Thomas & Hooper, is expected to arrive tomorrow afternoon. Mr. Bennett was scheduled to be in the city last week, but was prevented from starting when he originally planned because of the press of private business. Assistant City Manager George K. Hooper said today that Mr. Bennett was expected to arrive some time on Tuesday.

Architects to Be Here

All of the architects of the municipal group are to confer with Mr. Bennett during his visit in Pasadena. Arthur Brown, Jr., of San Francisco, a member of the firm of Bakewell & Brown, which is preparing the plans for the new city hall, is scheduled to be in Pasadena on Wednesday to confer with Mr. Bennett. It is expected that Myron Hunt, architect for the public library, and Edwin Bergstrom of Los Angeles and Cyril Bennett and Fitch H. Haskell of Pasadena, architects of the municipal auditorium, will also meet with the civic center consultant at some time during his coming visit to discuss the project of plans on which they are working.

Assistant City Manager Hooper said today that while it had been expected that the detailed plans and specifications for the library would be ready to submit for approval today, a slight delay had been encountered and they would not be ready for at least two weeks.

To Study Planting

One of the questions to be settled about the library will be the planting which is to be done in the patio and about the building. As the library is to be a building of the Spanish or Mediterranean type of architecture, Mr. Hunt feels that tall palms should be planted in the patio and scalloped vertical hedges should be set out between the building and the street, declares Mr. Hooper. It is proposed to have all three civic buildings harmonize as far as possible architecturally and also in the planting and beautification of the grounds, and for that reason considerable time and attention is being given to the planting details.

Mr. Hooper states it is also likely that Mr. Bennett while in Pasadena will consider with the City Planning Commission details concerning a proposed street plan for Pasadena. When Mr. Bennett's associate, William R. Parsons, was last in the city he discussed a street plan with the planning board and Board of City Directors.
