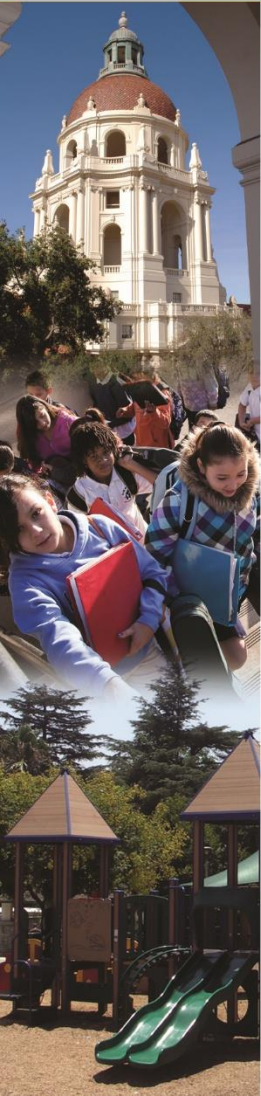

- **Use** culturally responsive communication to help build trust.



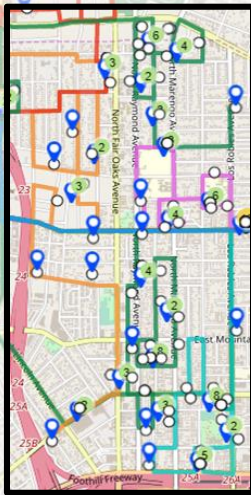
