RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council take the following actions:

1. Approve the City Manager's recommendation to contract with the City of Medical Hospital for the services provided by social workers residing in the City of Medical Hospital for the period of January 1, 1998 to December 31, 1998 at the sum of ₦2,326,000.
2. Create a panel of encryption firms for the first time to conduct a tender for the City of Medical Hospital for the services provided by social workers residing in the City of Medical Hospital for the period of January 1, 1999 to December 31, 1999 at the sum of ₦2,326,000.

EXPLANATION:

The City of Medical Hospital for the period of January 1, 1998 to December 31, 1998 has engaged the services of social workers residing in the City of Medical Hospital for the period of January 1, 1998 to December 31, 1998 at the sum of ₦2,326,000. The City of Medical Hospital for the period of January 1, 1999 to December 31, 1999 has engaged the services of social workers residing in the City of Medical Hospital for the period of January 1, 1999 to December 31, 1999 at the sum of ₦2,326,000.

It is important to maintain a contractual agreement with the City of Medical Hospital for the period of January 1, 1998 to December 31, 1998.

AFFIRMATIVE ACTION:


The contractor fully complies with the Affirmative Action in Contracting Ordinance and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder. Affirmative Action forms for HMH are on file with the City documenting its Affirmative Action/Equal Employment Opportunity Policy and a workforce composed of 89% protected class members.

Based on the City's policy of providing continuity of services to its residents, it is requested that this contract be partially exempt from the competitive selection process of the City's Affirmative Action in Contracting Ordinance pursuant to Pasadena's Municipal Code Section 4.09.060 (C)(2). Retaining the services of Huntington Memorial Hospital without interruption assures continuous attention to the psychosocial needs of the prenatal program clients. In addition, this contract for professional services is exempt from formal bidding pursuant to City Charter Section 1002 (f).

FISCAL IMPACT:

This action by City Council will have no fiscal impact. The funds for this contract in the amount of \$32,625 have been included in the Public Health Department's FY 1998 Adopted Budget, account #564000.
