SUBJECT: AUTHORIZATION OF THE SUBMITTAL OF GRANT APPLICATIONS TO THE CALIFORNIA INTEGRATED WASTE MANGEMENT BOARD FOR ALL AVAILABLE OIL GRANTS FOR THE SIXTH CYCLE – GRANT TERM 2000-2003

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council:

1. Adopt a resolution approving the application for a multi-year grant from the California Integrated Waste Management Board for Used Oil Recycling funds.
2. Authorize the City Manager or designee to enter into an agreement with the California Integrated Waste Management Board to promote enhancement of used motor oil recycling projects in the City of Pasadena.
3. Direct the funds received to be deposited into the previously established Used Oil Block Grant account 6461-406-764200-93000. The grant funds expire June 30, 2003.

BACKGROUND

On March 3, 1997 the City Council approved submittal of a grant application to the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) for the fifth grant cycle (June 30, 1997-June 30,2000) of the Used Oil Recycling Grant (City of Pasadena Resolution #7470). Over the three years of the grant cycle, the City received \$140,717 in funds to promote recycling of used oil.

On January 26, 2000 the City of Pasadena was notified that it is eligible for an award of \$49,532 for Year 1 of the Sixth Cycle of the Used Oil Recycling Grant to promote used oil recycling. This grant will allow the City to educate the public about proper used oil recycling and disposal.

The award methodology has changed and the funds are now awarded in advance rather than as a reimbursement. The new procedure requires an approved resolution authorizing grant applications for multiple years and allows the City of Pasadena to apply for future grants such as Opportunity Grants, Household Hazardous Waste Grants and others.


The CIWMB oversees the State of California's motor oil deposit program. An additional \$0.04 per quart is charged to motor oil consumers, which is then given back to them when they bring their motor oil in to be recycled. Unclaimed redemption monies are used to provide grant funds to municipalities for promoting used motor oil recycling programs.

According to the grant requirement, "all claimed costs to be funded by grant funds must be clearly related to implementation and operation of a local used oil collection program." The Street Maintenance and Integrated Waste Management Division qualifies in that we offer curbside collection of used motor oil, and we also have seven (7) State Certified oil collection centers within the City of Pasadena. The City will utilize the grant to enhance and expand the existing used motor oil program and continue public education and outreach.

FISCAL IMPACT


The Used Oil Recycling Grant award is \$49,532 for the fiscal year 2001. The funds are anticipated to be received and are included in the Refuse Collection Fund's fiscal year 2001 revenue projections. The Year 2 and Year 3 funds will be allocated to cover the years June 30, 2001 to June 30, 2002 and June 30 2002 to June 30, 2003, respectively. The City's allocation will be based on approximately \$0.30 per capita. The funds are anticipated to be received and included in the Refuse Collection Fund during fiscal years 2002 and 2003.
