The local UNA Chapter and the City of Pasadena would like to invite you to the 60th Anniversary Celebration of the United Nations Declaration of Human Rights. The event will take place on Thursday, December 11th from 7:00 p.m. – 8:30 p.m. at the Donald M. Wright Auditorium, Central Library.

The discussion will focus on higher education institutions' powerful role in communicating human rights issues in diverse urban environments with an emphasis in the Greater Los Angeles area. Panelists will include David Kaye, Executive Director of the UCLA School of Law International Human Rights Program, and other prominent authorities on human rights.

Keynote Speaker will be Jane Olson, Chair of International Board of Human Rights Watch.

The discussion will be followed by the official opening of the Art Center College of Design's Poster Exhibit commemorating the Anniversary in the Great Hall.

Office of the Mayor CENTRAL LIBRARIES INTERNET COMMONS OPENS

The much anticipated Internet Commons opened Thursday, October 9th. This new addition will double computer capacity at Central Library providing sixty computer stations in one location for free use up to an hour with a Pasadena/Glendale Public Library card. Additionally, there will be five pay-for-use computers that will allow customers to pay for extended computer time. This new format of one central consolidated computer location is anticipated to provide better customer service. Library staff will be available on-site to assist customers with PC reservations and computer questions. The Copy & Print Center will be located nearby to provide a variety of copy, fax and printer resources.

PWP'S INTEGRATED RESOURCE PLAN

"For more than 100 years, PWP has prided itself on being Pasadena's hometown utility," said Power Supply Director Gurcharan Bawa. "Our customers own this utility, and their needs, priorities and goals drive our planning. We can't stress enough how important it is for our customers to have input into PWP's Integrated Resource Plan."

Drafted with expert guidance from Global Energy Services, LLC, Pasadena's IRP will be "an incredibly complex document that considers available resources, demand forecasts, pricing, technology trends, environmental concerns, government regulations and market issues," Bawa said. "But first and foremost, we are considering our customers."

"We've heard again and again that our priorities should be reliable service, environmental leadership and stable and competitive rates," he said. "Balancing these goals is tricky. Green power and solar resources to date have been more expensive, but are perfect for meeting the city's environmental goals. PWP's

existing contract with a coal-fired plant in Utah, on the other hand, provides reliability and low cost, but it's certainly not a desirable choice from an environmental standpoint."

"Our goal with this IRP is to create an optimum balance of resources and environmental goals while ensuring excellent service and stable rates," he said. "We must hear all perspectives to create that perfect mix." Send us your perspective at

Water & Power PASADENA MARATHON

We invite you to join Pasadena Forward as we celebrate the inaugural Pasadena Marathon presented by Kaiser Permanente on Sunday, November 16, 2008. All residents of our beautiful city are encouraged to participate and line the race route to cheer on the runners, walkers and cyclists!

On the day of the event, Pasadena PD will secure the route at 5:00 am. The Bike Tour will let off at 6:00 am followed by the full and half marathon at 6:30 am and the 5k Run/Walk at 6:50 am. The Finish Festival at Pasadena City College will open free to the public from 6:00 am – 2:00 pm. All parking for the events will be at Pasadena City College.

During the race there will be restricted vehicular access along the route with cross-route traffic at designated intersections. Streets will re-open based on an 18 minute-per-mile pace with the complete course re-opening just before 3:00 pm. Residents and visitors to the City should

be advised to expect delays when traveling in Pasadena. Your patience and observance of traffic control is appreciated.

The route will be posted with no parking restrictions on the day of event from 1:00 am – 2:00 am. If your driveway exits onto the route and you will require access to your vehicle on the day of the event, please park your personal vehicle on the street just outside of the closure areas. The City will suspend the overnight parking restrictions on the morning of November 16th from 2:00 am – 6:00 am. During this time, overnight parking permits will NOT be required to park on City streets. However, all other parking restrictions and prohibitions apply including temporary tow-away zones.
