*****2005 ROSE BOWL DAY OF GAME PARKING ALERT*****

*Fans Asked to Arrive Early and Utilize Gold Line Train Service
or Chartered Buses from STAPLES Center Due to Limited Parking*

PASADENA, CA – Due to recent storms and flooding in the Los Angeles area, **there will be extremely limited parking at the Rose Bowl Game on January 1, 2005.** Several standard-parking areas, including Brookside Golf Course, will be limited for day of game parking. Accordingly, the Pasadena Police Dept. and California Highway Patrol (CHP) are asking fans to utilize the following modes of alternative transportation to the stadium:

- **Gold Line Train Service**

Directions - From the 210 FWY West, exit **Madre Ave.** Gold Line parking is located just north of the 210 FWY. Fans can take the Gold Line train to the **Memorial Park** exit with a short walk to **Parsons Engineering** at the corner of **Walnut** and **Fair Oaks (100 West Walnut)** where a shuttle service will take them to the stadium. **Shuttle service from the Parsons Lot begins at 10 a.m. on January 1.**

Fans can also park at **Union Station** (800 N. Alameda Street in Los Angeles) taking the Gold Line train to the **Memorial Park** exit and follow the same route as mentioned above. Fans needing information regarding the Gold Line can call **1-800-266-6883.**

- **STAPLES Center Park-and-Ride**

Fans can park at the STAPLES Center and take chartered buses to the Rose Bowl for a **fee of \$10.** The STAPLES Center parking lot will open at **8:00 a.m.** and bus services to the Rose Bowl will start at **9:00 a.m.** **The STAPLES Center Park-and-Ride will be available to the first 2,500 fans only, so plan to arrive early).** Immediately following the game, return bus service will be available at the same drop-off point prior to the game. **Fans using the STAPLES Center Park and Ride should enter Lot 3 off of Olympic Blvd, between Figueroa and Georgia Streets.**

Fans deciding to drive to the Rose Bowl on Jan. 1 can expect significant delays and long walks to the stadium.
