# Pasadena Sister Cities Committee Annual Report September, 2000- August 2001

2000-2001 was a very busy time for all members of the Pasadena Sister Cities Committee (PSCC). As in the past, the Committee hosted exchange students and interns, tour groups and visiting dignitaries from our five sister cities of Ludwigshafen, Germany, Mishima, Japan, Jarvenpaa, Finland, Vanadzor, Armenia and Xicheng District, Beijing, China. In addition, our Student Exchange Coordinator, with valuable impute from PSCC Sub Chairs and members of the General Committee, revised the guidelines used in our Student/Intern Exchange Program. The outcome of the revision was an even stronger exchange this year.

Below are listed some of the highlights of each Sub Committee's activities during 2000-01. Highlights include:

#### Ludwigshafen, Germany Michael Warner, chair

Working to develop partnerships between upper schools in Ludwigshafen and Pasadena via the Internet and an exchange between a music program in Pasadena and a music school in Ludwigshafen, hosting student, Esther Kuntz, from Ludwigshafen while she attended PCC during the summer session and intern Ingrid Keller as she completed her assignment at the Pasadena City Credit Union from September 23-November 3<sup>rd</sup>, arranging a display as part of the November PSCC Exhibit at the Pasadena Public Library and selecting Pasadena students, Michelle Carrillo and Kai Zhu as exchange students.

# Mishima, Japan Bruce Hisayasu, chair (through October) June Takanouchi, chair

The October 17-20<sup>th</sup> visit by Mishima Mayor, Masashi Koike, 41 members of MIRA, and several members of the Mishima City Council (visit included a tour of PCC, CAL-TECH, JPL and the ROSE BOWL, meetings with Mayor Bill Bogaard, James Kossler, President of PCC, Morris Birnbaum, JPL and numerous Pasadenans), hosting two college students from Mishima, selecting two students, Suzanna Avetyan and Carl Torres-Garfias of Pasadena as exchange students, arranging for Mieko Kamon and Bryan Takeda to escort four 13 year olds who attended the Mt. Fuji Summer Camp, and arranging a display as part of the November PSCC Exhibit at the Pasadena Public Library.

# Jarvenpaa, Finland Karen Holgerson, chair

The attendance of Deputy Finnish Consul, Nicola Lindertz at the celebration in honor of the gift of 1100 books given to the Pasadena Public Library and PCC by Xicheng District, Beijing, China, arranging a display in the November PSCC Exhibit at the Pasadena Library, several special events held at Ms. Holgerson's home for summer exchange students, hosting two students from Jarvenpaa, (Ari Salmi and Tuomas Silen, selecting Pasadena student, Matthew Prieto to visit Jarvenpaa, leading in the work on expanding and revising the guidelines for exchange students and interns.

# Vanadzor, Armenia Michael Matosian, chair

The study and selection of several schools in Vanadzor for much needed repair under the auspices of the World Bank Project, preparation for the November,2001 arrival of the Mayor of Vanadzor and group for the celebration of the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Affiliation with Pasadena.

### Xicheng District, Beijing, China Elmer Christensen, chair

Organizing the month of November PSCC Cultural Exhibit and the Reception on the 15<sup>th</sup> at the Pasadena Public Library as part of the "Gift of Books" by Xicheng District, Beijing, China to Pasadena, (presentation of the books was made by An Wenbin from the Chinese Consulate,) hosting the New Moon Children's Chorus of Xicheng District from March 25-April 2<sup>nd</sup>, (the 35 member chorus of 10-12 year old boys and girls stayed in the homes of local Girl Scouts while performing in several Pasadena schools and in

public concert), hosting two librarians from Xicheng District, hosting a delegation on November 22<sup>nd</sup> with a luncheon and brief tour of PCC, Blair High School, PSCC and Blair, together, being invited by the U.S. State Department to submit a proposal for a Chinese/American high school exchange. (This I Earn program is sponsored in part by the government to help young people become acquainted around the world via the Internet and student exchanges. Blair submitted a proposal to exchange with Xicheng District Middle School, 161).

#### Student Exchange Program Lyn Elliott, chair

Pasadena sent five students to our sister cities during the summer. Michelle Carrillo and Kai Zhu went to Ludwigshafen, Mathew Prieto went to Jarvenpaa and Suzanna Avetyan and Carl Torres-Garflias went to Mishima. In January, all schools, public and private in Pasadena including PCC, were contacted and asked to notify students of the Exchange Program sponsored by PSCC. Applications were made available at each school for students 17-24 who were residents of Pasadena or attended school in Pasadena. Interviews were held in March. Those selected took part in an orientation meeting in May and departed at the close of the school year in June, returning the first week of August.

#### Intern Program Fred Alcantar, chair

Ingrid Keeler of Luwigshafen arrived September 23<sup>rd</sup> and worked at the Pasadena Federal Credit Union until November 3<sup>rd</sup>. After some travel, she returned to Ludwigshafen November 23<sup>rd</sup>. Both the student exchange and intern programs were very successful with housing, meals, and many activities provided by Pasadena host families from within and without the Pasadena Sister Cities Committee.
