# CEREMONIAL MATTERS

Mayor Bogaard announced that tonight's meeting would adjourn in memory of Roy Begley.

The City Clerk administered the oath of office to David Jason Hauser as Human Relations Commissioner.

Mayor Bogaard presented a commendation in recognition of Villa Esperanza's 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. The commendation was accepted by Ms. R-lene Mijares DeLang, Ms. Katie Nack, and Ms. Dottie Nelson.

Mayor Bogaard gave recognition to the Boys Flag Football Team, winner of the Southern California Municipal Athletic Federation Tournament. Recognition was also given to participants in the Junior Olympics.

Mr. Raymond Dashner, Pasadena resident, spoke in commemoration of Mr. Roy Begley. Mr. Dashner highlighted the accomplishments of Mr. Begley to the community, and distributed a CD of various compositions of Mr. Begley.

Ms. Julia Begley and Mr. Dermot Begley spoke in commemoration of their father and announced a memorial fund is being established to spearhead a design competition for a bench in the Lower Arroyo in memory of their father.

The Mayor and members of the Council acknowledged the volunteer work of Mr. Begley and Mr. Dashner. It was noted many areas in the Arroyo are now accessible due to the volunteer efforts of Mr. Begley and Mr. Dashner. It was suggested that the memorial be placed in a suitable location in an accessible area in the Arroyo.

Mr. Darryl Henriques, South Pasadena resident, spoke regarding the Rose Bowl Aquatics Center's record of compliance with its agreement with the City.

Mr. Robert Wittry, Pasadena resident, spoke on the topic of property setbacks and stressed the need to review setback requirements to make sure they do not impact City trees.

**OLD BUSINESS** 

At the request of Councilmember Haderlein, Chair of the Public Safety Committee, this item was held for the meeting of March 4, 2002, to allow additional information to be gathered and reviewed by the Public Safety Committee.

# **COUNCIL COMMENTS**

Councilmember Tyler referenced an article in the February issue of <u>Sunset Magazine</u> and noted that Pasadena and the Bungalow Heaven area was listed as the West's best place to live.

Councilmember Madison provided a brief update regarding the matter concerning two oak trees on Hurlbut Street, which was discussed at the last Council meeting two weeks ago. He reported one tree was trimmed, \$20,000 of mitigation funds was received for fresh planting of trees, and the larger second oak tree was trimmed instead of removed. He noted three arborists have reviewed the larger tree and expect that it will survive the trimming. He stressed the importance in getting the pending Tree Protection Ordinance before the Council for adoption as quickly as possible, and to make sure the ordinance addresses both public and private trees and that systems are in place to make sure that this type of situation is not overlooked in the future.

The City Manager added that the oak tree that was expected to be removed received a heavy trim and it is expected the tree will survive the trimming and staff will continue to monitor the tree. She indicated that the Tree Protection Ordinance is scheduled to be reviewed by Council in 30 days, and noted the Urban Forestry Advisory Committee is currently working on the ordinance. The City Manager stated that she will provide information to Council on what staff is doing now as far as the administrative process in reviewing trees in conjunction with development projects, and noted the ordinance will add to this process.

# PRESENTATION BY LARY KAPLAN, TRUST FOR PUBLIC LANDS

Mr. Kaplan distributed an informational packet regarding the Trust for Public Land, summarized the work of the organization, and responded to questions from Council.

The City Manager reminded the Council that approval was given to move forward with an inventory of land citywide that might be used as a pocket park or as open space, and noted she would be pleased to work with Mr. Kaplan in identifying the best opportunities for pocket parks or open space.

Councilmember Gordo noted that Washington Park is going through the master plan process, expressed the hope that the park can be expanded, and welcomed representatives from the Trust for Public Land to attend these planning meetings.

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Mr. Kaplan responded that he or a representative would be happy to attend the planning meetings.

The Mayor and Councilmembers thanked Mr. Kaplan for his presentation.

# AUTHORIZATION TO PURCHASE CERTAIN NON-CONTIGUOUS ABANDONED RAILROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY ALONG THE NORTH SIDE OF WALNUT STREET FROM FOOTHILL BOULEVARD TO SUNNYSLOPE AVENUE AND SALE THEREOF TO THE ADJACENT LAND OWNERS

# Recommendation of City Manager:

(a) Find and determine that the certain abandoned railroad rightof-way along the north side of Walnut Street between the Foothill Boulevard and Sunnyslope Avenue falls under Class 12 of categorically exempt projects and thus, exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"), and direct the City Clerk to file a Notice of Exemption with the Los Angeles County Recorder;

(b) Declare that this certain abandoned railroad right-of-way segment is exempt from the competitive sale requirements of Chapter 4.02 of the Pasadena Municipal Code; and

(c) Authorize the City Manager or her designee to negotiate with the Los Angeles to Pasadena Blue Line Construction Authority and the land owners adjacent to and south of the abandoned railroad right-of-way segment, and to enter into and execute on behalf of the City of Pasadena the contracts, deeds and/or other documents required to acquire and convey the City's interests therein.

Councilmember Madison, Chair of the Economic Development and Technology Committee, introduced the item.

The City Manager summarized the agenda report.

City Attorney Michele Bagneris clarified that this sale is exempt from the competitive sale requirements of Chapter 4.02 of the Pasadena

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Municipal Code because the property does not meet the definition of surplus property as defined in Section 4.02.010 of said Code. She stated the definition of surplus property applies to property which is not needed for the purpose for which it was acquired, and noted this property is being sold for the same purpose for which it was acquired and thus it does not meet the definition of surplus property.

Mr. Richard Bruckner, Director of Planning and Development, responded to questions from Council.

Following brief discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Madison, seconded by Vice Mayor Little, to approve the City Manager's recommendation. (Motion unanimously carried) (Absent: Councilmember Holden)

removal; and

(2) contract with a shopping cart retrieval service that displays a Pasadena business license or pay an additional fee to the City of Pasadena when they apply for a new, or renew, a business license.

(b) Direct staff to prepare an amendment to the Schedule of Taxes, Fees and Charges to include an additional business license fee for markets that utilize shopping carts as part of their daily business operations but do not contract with a cart retrieval service.
(c) Direct the City Attorney to amend the Municipal Code to allow

code enforcement to issue citations for a business' unauthorized use or possession of another business' shopping cart.

Assistant City Manager Enrique Martinez summarized the agenda report and responded to questions from Council.
