SUBJECT: Contract Award to – Doug Martin Contracting Company, Inc.  
for the Slurry Seal of Streets - 2003  
for an Amount Not to Exceed \$316,000.00

## RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

1. Accept the bid dated July 23, 2003 submitted by Doug Martin Contracting Company, Inc. in response to the Specifications for the Slurry Seal of Streets - 2003, reject all other bids received, and authorize the City Manager to enter into such contract as is required.
2. Acknowledge the project to be categorically exempt under Section 21084 of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) in accordance with Article 19, Section 15301 (Class 1), subsection (c) of the Resources Agency of California Guidelines (repair of existing public streets) pursuant to the findings of the Secretary of the Resources Agency and authorize the City Manager to execute and the City Clerk to file a Notice of Exemption for the project with the Los Angeles County Clerk.
3. Approve a Journal Voucher recognizing private capital in the amount of \$26,680 and appropriating it to Budget Account No. 73710, Prevention Maintenance – Asphalt Streets.

## BACKGROUND:

This project consists of slurry seal of one hundred and ten street segments. It covers 17 miles of City streets. A list of all street segments is attached. The work will begin in the northeast part of the City and proceed in a counter-clockwise direction. The slurry seal work includes repainting of existing permanent traffic striping and installing raised pavement markers.

Plans and specifications for the subject project, which is included in the proposed 2004 Capital Improvement Program, were prepared by the Department of Public Works. In accordance with Section 4.08.070 of the Pasadena Municipal Code, bids have been requested and received.

A finding of compliance with the General Plan was previously made and is shown on page 2.1 of the FY 2003-2008 Capital Improvement Program.

Under the State Guidelines for the Implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), this project is categorically exempt since the work consists of the maintenance of existing public streets. Therefore, it is recommended that a Notice of Exemption be filed with the Los Angeles County Clerk.

This project was advertised in the Pasadena Journal on July 10, 2003. In addition, the Notice Inviting Bids was published in five trade publications. Bid packets were obtained by 11 Contractors, 4 of whom submitted bids for the project.

Following advertising, bids were received on July 30, 2003 and are as follows:

3. Pavement Coatings Company, Cypress	\$303,299.75
4. Roy Allan Slurry Seal, Inc., Santa Fe Springs	\$356,269.00

The lowest bid received was 16% lower than the Engineer's Estimate of \$345,000.00.

It is recommended that Doug Martin Contracting Company, Inc. be awarded the contract for this project as they are the lowest responsive and responsible bidder and that all other bids be rejected. The proposed contract with Doug Martin Contracting Company, Inc. fully complies with the competitive bidding ordinance and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder as did the Contractor selection process. The Contractor has indicated that the award of this contract will result in no new hires to the present workforce.

The contract for this project will be set as follows:

Base Bid	\$287,239.25
Contingencies	\$28,760.75
CONTRACT NOT TO EXCEED	<u>\$316,000.00</u>

It is anticipated that construction will begin in late September, 2003 and be completed in, November, 2003.

Private funds in the amount of \$1,290 were received to re-slurry streets which were cut for new water services. Funds from 20 property owners in the aggregate amount of \$25,390 were received to repair damaged sidewalk or driveways.

It is necessary that a Journal Voucher be approved recognizing these funds and appropriating them to budget account 73710 (Preventive Maintenance – Asphalt Streets).


FISCAL IMPACT:

Funds for this project are available in Budget Account 73710 (Preventive Maintenance – Asphalt Streets).


