A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF PASADENA URGING SETTLEMENT OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY STRIKE
WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) Board and its Mechanic's Union have entered into the sixth week of a strike that has shut down the transit system; and,
WHEREAS, the strike is causing significant negative impact on those who have no alternative to public transit; and,
WHEREAS, the regional as well as the local economy has been and continues to be greatly impacted; and,
WHEREAS, the City Council is seriously concerned that the two sides have ceased any meaningful negotiations or discussions; and,
WHEREAS, the City of Pasadena, while taking no position on the issues that have caused the strike, expresses its strong desire that the two sides meet as often as possible to work to resolve the issues and consider all alternatives so that the buses and trains and other operations can return to normal service; and,
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Pasadena does hereby urge the MTA Board and Mechanic's Union to meet and resolve their issues as quickly as possible as a swift end to the strike is in the best interests of our citizens, businesses and students.
