SUBJECT: Ordinance Suspending Pasadena Municipal Code Sections 9.36.220 (amplified sound) and 9.36.230 (general noise source) for Four 2005 Scheduled UCLA College Football Night Games

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the City Council direct the City Attorney to prepare an ordinance suspending Pasadena Municipal Code Sections 9.36.220 (amplified sound) and 9.36.230 (general noise source) for four potential UCLA night games occurring on the following dates – September 10 versus Rice University; October 1 versus Washington; October 8 versus California; October 22 versus Oregon State until 11:00 p.m., rather than the current 10:00 p.m. time limit.

BACKGROUND:

Each game will kick off at a designated time, however staff may not be notified until the Monday preceding the game due to television network coverage of a particular game.

Traditionally, college football games have a running game time of approximately three hours, however, if one or all of the above mentioned night games should last longer than three hours and/or go into overtime; suspension of the Pasadena Noise Ordinance may be necessary.

UCLA's 2005 scheduled of potential night games is as follows:


ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT:
