2002 - 2003 Student Parking Permit Application:

Driving to school and parking on campus are privileges granted to students at Maranatha. Students who receive a parking permit must abide by the residential speed limit of 25 MPH, follow specific routes to arrive and depart from school, and park their vehicle in the assigned space. Permits will be issued on the following basis; carpooling applications (driving with at least two additional students in the vehicle), hardship (distance from school, special circumstances), grade level of student. There are a limited number of student spaces, not all students who apply for a parking permit will receive one. There is no parking on the streets by MHS faculty, staff, students, or family. **Applications are to be turned into the main office by Friday September 6th. Applications turned in after this date will be processed after the start of school as parking spaces become available.**

General Information

★ Traffic Plan: Please note the enclosed traffic plan regarding student parking and drop-off and pick-up areas and general parking.

There is no street parking for Maranatha staff, students or parents under any circumstances. Community Meeting Notes October 23, 2002

Number of neighbors in attendance: 12

The meeting was opened with prayer by Mr. Chet Crane, Head of School, who then explained that the meeting was held in order for neighbors to present concerns re. traffic and/or other issues that may have arisen since school has begun. Mr. Crane introduced John Rouse, Steve Bundy, Nancy Hillis, Doug Barnett and Dr. Gary Clark.

Mr. Doug Barnett spoke regarding the changes that we have made to the parking lots to increase the number of parking places. He explained which lots are being used by students and faculty, and about the ingress and egress route for student drop off in Townsend Parking Lot. He also mentioned about construction completed in Lower Latourette.

Dr. Gary Clark, who was asked to monitor the questions and answer period, told about having come on campus in the morning; he was very impressed with the traffic flow and parking situation. He then asked for members of the audience to express concerns or comments.

Neighbor: Harvest Rock is having a conference. How is the parking going to be handled? She mentioned how difficult it has been in the past,

Mr. Bundy: He said that all three organizations (WCIU, Maranatha and Harvest Rock) are working together to help alleviate the parking situation. MHS is using a local church log during the day for some of their faculty. WCIU is working closely with Harvest Rock to mitigate parking problems in the streets. Harvest Rock has sent a notice to conference attendees to be courteous and quiet, not to park across driveways, etc. They have been told that if there is an infraction, one warning will be given.

Mr. Bundy also said that WCIU is sending a letter to neighbors regarding the dates of the conference. Three phone numbers will be given for neighbors to use if they have a complaint; one is a 24-hour hot line with a live-person responding; one is the 24-hour security phone number; the third is the voice-mail number of Mr. Bundy's assistant. The third number is to be used if a situation is not resolved appropriately.

He also explained that the City of Pasadena gives allowance for overnight parking (a short-term exception) during this conference. He said that they are working hard to make this go smoothly. Campus parking lots will be filled first, but there will be an overflow into the neighborhood. The largest meetings will be held in the evenings, with 300 cars on campus. Harvest Rock Church will be having people direct traffic, and walking the streets to check that cars are parked correctly. If cars are not moved immediately, they will be towed.

Neighbor: Why have the neighbors not been contacted before? During conferences in the past people have parked in driveways. Residents have put up signs on trees in the parkway saying, "DO NOT PARK IN DRIVEWAY".

Neighbor: How many complaints have there been?

Dr. Clark: "I've not received any. I see very little traffic on Sierra Bonita." He also commented that he had learned just today that Harvest Rock has a school called The Call. Some parking and traffic infractions could come from these students.

Neighbor: In the CUP Maranatha has been restricted from having portable signs on the streets around the campus. On Sundays there are many portable signs placed by churches on the streets. Is there a city code re. these signs?

Mr. Bundy: He responded that he is not aware of a code related to this.

Dr. Clark: He said someone should find out about this.

Neighbor: There was a comment about the November 6 hearing.

Mr. Crane commented that the public meeting on November 6 is scheduled to determine how Maranatha is meeting the requirements of the CUP.

Neighbors: There was a complaint that MHS parents/students make u-turns on Sierra Bonita just below Howard. Students are dropped off and cars return south on Sierra Bonita. One lady said they actually pull into her driveway to turn around.

Mr. Bundy: WCIU is working on developing a CUP, which may result in a Master Plan for the whole campus. He explained further that the restrictions listed in the Maranatha CUP are not applicable to other organizations on the WCIU campus. Judson School is not restricted, however, they have been asked to follow MHS's traffic flow. Parking/traffic problems are not necessarily caused by MHS.

Neighbor: There are parking restrictions in some neighborhoods that apply to all drivers other than those who live on the streets. Residents have parking permits for street parking. If they have guests they have to get permits for their guests. This eliminates other than resident parking on their streets.

Dr. Clark: There is not need for waiting for the city to put restrictions on other organizations on the WCIU campus. The university can give directions to Judson School and other tenants that they must follow. Owners have the responsibility to set rules for tenants.

Neighbor: This lady works at the Judson School and stated there are very few Judson people not in compliance with the traffic restrictions.

Mr. Rouse: He explained that our parked cars are being monitored. From 7:30-7:50 a.m. teachers stand at the corner of Sierra Bonita and direct students. Parents/students not in compliance have been stopped and spoken to. We deal with these infractions. We have high compliance. When parents don't cooperate, they are notified that their student will suffer consequences.

Neighbor: On Sunday there was a fistfight in the Mott parking lot. There were no security guards in sight. The police were called.

Mr. Bundy: The security guards are required to monitor both inside and outside the buildings. We can't control what neighbor kids do--WCIU has worked with the police and even visited homes to try and resolve problems. He mentioned that Altrio has blocked some of our parking while installing cables.

Dr. Clark: He stated that he was really impressed with the way the parking loop worked. After speaking with the MHS monitor stationed on Elizabeth at the Townsend exit driveway, he felt that asking the city to allow some of the traffic to go east on Elizabeth would help eliminate the bottleneck on Elizabeth and Hill.

Neighbor: There is a lot more parking on streets at night since MHS has come.

Mr. Crane: We have had very few evening events. Other than this meeting, all evening events are listed on the calendar sent to neighbors.

Neighbor: On Sundays there is a lot of street parking on the north end, yet the Hudson Taylor parking lot is usually 1/2 full. Abundant Life people need to park in lots.

Neighbor: He commented that MHS students are supposed to eat on campus, but he sees a lot of people leaving for lunch.

Mr. Rouse: During the first couple of weeks of school a few students tried to leave at lunchtime. These students were suspended for a day.

Mr. Bundy: He explained that other people on campus are free to leave at lunchtime. He explained that there are 165 residents on campus; approximately 100 are college students. There are other activities on campus, as well.

Neighbor/works at Judson: A good number of Judson students who are in uniforms similar to Maranatha's live in the neighborhood around the campus. She also stated that Judson was concerned about having high school students on campus with their young students, but no problems have arisen.

The meeting was dismissed at approximately 8:00 p.m.




