SUBJECT: AUTHORIZATION TO ISSUE A PURCHASE ORDER CONTRACT TO

MOTOROLA INC. FOR THE PURCHASE OF EMERGENCY RADIO

COMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT

#### RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council authorize the issuance of a purchase order contract to Motorola, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$172,396 for the purchase of radio communications equipment.

Competitive bidding is not required for this transaction pursuant to City Charter section 1002(H), contracts with other governmental entities or their contractors for labor, material, supplies or services

#### **BACKGROUND**

On December 12, 2005, the City Council approved a purchase order with Motorola, Inc. in the amount of \$1,950,000 for the purchase of radio communications equipment for the Fire Department. As stated in the December 12th agenda report, this purchase was made necessary as a result of new FCC regulations requiring emergency communications equipment upgrades. The funding source for this purchase was the 2005 Equipment Lease Financing.

Additionally, on March 13, 2006 the City Council recognized and appropriated \$172.396 to the Fire Department from the FY05 State Homeland Security Program grant fund for the purchase of radio equipment. The Fire Department is requesting that the City Council approve an additional purchase order with Motorola, Inc. for an amount not to exceed \$172,396, which will complete the Department's radio communication equipment upgrade.

The County of Los Angeles currently has a Master Purchase Agreement with Motorola, Inc. for the purchase of radios which is valid through June 30, 2007. Motorola, Inc. has offered to extend the same pricing and discount to the City of Pasadena. Moreover, approving Motorola, Inc. as the sole provider of radio equipment will ensure compatibility with our current inventory.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

On March 13, 2006, the City Council recognized and appropriated \$172,396 to the Fire Department from the FY05 State Homeland Security Program grant fund for the purchase of radio equipment. Due to the grant appropriation, sufficient funds for this purchase are available in the Department's Fiscal Year 2007 operating budget.
