<b>County of San Diego</b>	<p>Preference is for co-location on street lights. The applicable tier is a function of the Zoning as well as type of installation proposed.</p>	<p>All applications must submit a "coverage gap map". This is what the County uses as a Justification Study.</p>	<p>Required to submit an affidavit stating they comply with emission regulations- but no testing or monitoring required.</p>	<p>Applies to High Visibility only (monopoles, faux trees, lattice towers etc). 6 years if values at less than \$10K, 10 years if valued at 10-500K and 15 years if valued over 500k. May be extended if facility is modified to be less visible.</p>	<p>No "Opportunities Map". However, 18 zones are "preferred" and preferred locations such as County facilities, and co-locating on street lights, freeway overpasses etc. in non-residential zones. <b>City of Pasadena</b>	<p>Limited to facilities that are located on City-owned property or within a City –owned street such as a street light, utility pole, traffic signal or sign, but not on poles less than 25 feet. No monopoles are allowed. Notification proposed for 300-foot radius and neighborhood associations.</p>	<p>Subject to review and approval of an administrative permit by the Department of Public Works.</p>	<p>Propose a Justification Study for Wireless applications in the public right-of-way demonstrating the coverage gap and alternate sites and designs considered.</p>	<p>Propose compliance verification upon installation and at 10 year intervals.</p>	<p>Propose 10 years for all types of installations. Can be administratively extended for additional 10 years if emission compliance and code requirements are met.</p>	<p>Propose an Opportunities Site Map that specifies City owned property that may be a preferred site for co-located facilities. Also propose development incentives for sites on the map.</p>
