**TO:** Honorable Mayor and City Council  
**FROM:** Department of Public Works  
**SUBJECT: AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF A PURCHASE ORDER WITH BOERNER TRUCK CENTER FOR THE PURCHASE OF THREE CRANE CARRIER REFUSE SIDE LOADER TRUCKS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$857,901**

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the City Council:

- 1) Authorize the issuance of a purchase order to Boerner Truck Center in an amount not to exceed \$857,901 for the purchase of three Side Loading Refuse Trucks;
- 2) Reject all other bids presented; and
- 3) Find that this action is exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061 (b) (3), the General Rule that CEQA only applies to projects that may have an affect on the environment.

### **BACKGROUND:**

Automated side loading refuse packers are used for the City's residential mixed waste collection service, residential yard waste, and residential recycling collection. These vehicles service over 27,000 residential customers weekly.

This vehicle purchase will replace vehicles #0836 and #0838, both 1998 refuse side loading packers, and #681, a 1987 side loading refuse packer, that have all reached the end of their useful lifecycle. When the replacement vehicles are delivered all three vehicles will be salvaged per City policy.

Additionally, these replacement vehicles will be powered by compressed natural gas (CNG) in compliance with the South Coast Air Quality Management District Fleet Rule #1193.

This purchase will also help the City maintain an effective and cost-efficient fleet essential for successful and timely delivery of waste collection services.

A Notice Inviting Bids was published on April 29, 2010. At the bid opening on May 18, 2010, two firms submitted bids. The bid results are as follows:

The bid submitted by Boerner Truck Center was the lowest responsive and responsible bid. Therefore, it is recommended that the bid be awarded to Boerner Truck Center in the amount of \$ 857,901.

\*Los Angeles Freightliner submitted bids for two different body types.

**COUNCIL POLICY CONSIDERATION:**

This purchase supports the City of Pasadena's adoption of the United Nations Urban Environmental Accords (UEA) action 14: purchase of advanced emission controls on all public fleets to reduce particulate matter and smog-forming emissions by 50% by the year 2012.


**ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT:**

This purchase complies with the South Coast Air Quality Management District fleet rule 1193 requiring all public and private solid waste collection fleet operators to purchase alternative fueled vehicles.


**FISCAL IMPACT:**

This equipment is a budgeted replacement in the FY 2010 Operating Budget, and Refuse Funds in the amount of \$857,901 are available for use in the Street Maintenance and Integrated Waste Management budget (account 8505-406-764120).


