Section 1.24.010(A) – General penalty

"No person shall violate or fail to comply with any provision or requirement of this code. Any person who violates or fails to comply with any provision or requirement of this code shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, unless (1) such violation or failure is designated as an infraction or is subsequently prosecuted as an infraction, in which case such person is guilty of an infraction; or (2) such a violation or failure is prosecuted as a civil administrative action pursuant to Chapter 1.25 or Chapter 1.26 of this title."

Section 14.16.030(A) - Certificate of Occupancy Required

"No person shall occupy, change the use of or sell, exchange, rent, lease or otherwise permit any unit which is hereafter vacated by the occupant thereof to be reoccupied until a certificate of occupancy, quadrennial certificate of occupancy or temporary certificate of occupancy is issued by the administrator, as hereinafter provided.

[A] With respect to single-family units and duplexes, such inspection shall occur each time the unit is sold, rented, leased or exchanged."

Section 14.12.320 - Permit separate for each building.

"No person shall erect, construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move, improve, remove, convert or demolish any building, or cause or permit the same to be done, without first obtaining a separate building permit for each such building from the housing and community development department, in the manner and according to the applicable conditions prescribed in Chapter 3 of the Pasadena building code."

Section 14.04.030 - Violation of building code.

"It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to erect, construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move, improve, remove, convert, or demolish, equip, use, occupy, or maintain any building or structure in the City, or cause same to be done, contrary to or in violation of any of the provisions of this chapter. Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and each such person shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each and every day or portion thereof during which any violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance is committed, continued, or permitted, and upon conviction of any such violation such persons shall be punished by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, or by both such fine and imprisonment. In addition to the above penalty provisions, of any of the provisions of this chapter may be subject to the administrative proceedings set forth in Chapter 1.25 of this code."

Section 14.04.015 - Zoning permit required

"A zoning permit may be required for items exempted from building permit requirements under Appendix 1 Section 105.2. Exempted work shall not violate any provisions of this code, Federal, State, Local laws, or regulations."

When the current litter of nine Pit Bull Terrier puppies reach the age of four months, their number must be reduced in compliance with Section 6.24.010(B) of the Pasadena Municipal Code which prohibits more than four dogs over four months of age from being maintained on a single property in a residential neighborhood.
- 8. Dog licenses shall be obtained immediately for any puppies that lawfully remain at 1315 Hastings Ranch Road once they reach four month of age.
- 9. Messrs. Abruzzese and Festa shall pay veterinary bills in the amount of \$146.32 (submitted as Exhibit F), and all fees accrued to Pasadena Humane Society prior to the release of "Eva," "Baby," and "Madi."

Super Liquor – Modification of Business Operating Conditions

Super Liquor is seeking relief from five of the 21 business operating conditions imposed by the Code Enforcement Commission and the City Council subsequent to public hearings in 2009 where the business was determined to be in violation of the City's "Deemed Approved Ordinance." Specifically, Super Liquor is seeking relief from Conditions No's 3, 9, 10, 18 and 19. Those conditions are referenced below.

- Condition No. 3: "The sale or stocking of single containers of distilled spirits, beer, malt beverages, and wine coolers in sizes of 12 oz. or less is prohibited, but may be sold in manufacturer pre-packed multi-unit quantities." The applicant states that "distilled spirits should be removed from the list of prohibited single containers".
- Condition No. 9: "Management shall employ a private security guard to patrol the business premises and the adjacent sidewalks, including the north side of Orange Grove Boulevard adjacent to the property, during all hours of business operation to ensure that no littering, loitering or consumption of alcohol occurs, and make prompt notification to the Pasadena Police Department of instances of loitering, the public consumption of alcohol, or other illegal activity." The applicant states that "Super Liquor will continue to notify the Police Department of illegal activity, but should not be required to employ a private security guard."
- Condition No. 10: "It shall be the responsibility of the business owner/operators of
 the business to remove identifiable litter from the premises and the public right of
 way (limited to the north side of East Orange Grove up to 100 feet from the
 premises.)" The applicant states that "this condition requires clarification as to
 parameters, and the extent to which Super Liquor would be responsible for the
 upkeep of the neighboring apartment complex or neighboring business. The

conditions should also be rewritten to limit Super Liquor's responsibility to remove identifiable litter from the public sidewalks up to only 50 feet from the premises."

- Condition No. 18: "All alcoholic beverages containers shall be identified with a sticker that has the name of the business establishment. Translucent plastic bags shall be identified in the same manner," and; The applicant states that "this condition should be eliminated in its entirety."
- Condition No. 19: "Business hours of operation shall be between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. daily with the sale of alcohol to occur only between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. daily." The applicant states that "this condition should be eliminated in its entirety, and Super Liquor should be able to continue to run its business during its current hours of operation, 6:30 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., with no restriction on the sale of alcohol.

Section 14.50.040 - Prohibited activities or conditions.

It is declared unlawful and a public nuisance for any person owning, leasing, occupying, or having charge or possession of any property in this city to maintain such property, regardless of whether such property contains a conforming or legal nonconforming use or structure, in a manner that any of the following conditions or activities are found to exist thereon:

1. The accumulation of dirt, litter, junk, salvage materials, lumber or other debris visible from a street, sidewalk, alley or neighboring property, or verified through other lawful means.

- 5. Broken or discarded furniture, household or business equipment, shopping carts or similar items, placed outdoors for more than 24 hours.
- 8. Overgrown vegetation likely to harbor rats, or other vermin, or which attain such growth as to become a fire menace when dry or which are otherwise noxious, dangerous or unsightly.
- 15. Any structure in a state of substantial deterioration, including but not limited to: peeling paint on a façade, broken windows, roof in disrepair, damaged porch, broken steps, or other deterioration or disrepair, visible from a public street, sidewalk, or from neighboring properties, where such condition would have a tendency to depreciate substantially the aesthetic environment or property values of surrounding properties.
- 17. Dirt, sand, gravel, concrete, scrap metal, wood, building materials or other similar materials kept, stored, deposited or accumulated on property for a period of 30 days (excluding such time when work is in progress pursuant to a valid building or other construction permit.

Section 14.12.690 - Hazardous or unsanitary premises.

Those premises on which an accumulation of weeds, vegetation, junk, dead organic matter, debris, garbage, offal, rat harborages, stagnant water, combustible materials and similar materials or conditions exist constitute fire, health or safety hazards

Section 14.29.040 - Flammable Vegetation - Standards.

Flammable weeds, trees and vegetation shall be subject to the following controls and restrictions for the purpose of preventing the spread, intensification or ignition of fires.

G. A vertical clearance of 5 feet shall be maintained between the roof surface of any building or structure and any foliage, limb or branch of any tree or other foliage which overhangs the roof of such building or structure.

Section 14.12.610 - Housing Code - Structural hazards.

Structural hazards shall include but not be limited to the following:

H. Fireplaces or chimneys which lift, bulge or settle due to defective material or deterioration;

C. Case No. CTP2010-02682 - 1395 El Sereno Ave - Council District # 1

Violations: Pasadena Municipal Code

Section 1.24.010(A):- General Penalty

Section 14.12.320 - Permit-Separate for each building

"No person shall erect, construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move improve, remove, convert or demolish any building, or cause or permit the same to be done, without first obtaining a separate building permit for each such building from the housing and community development department, in the manner and according to the applicable conditions prescribed in chapter 3 of the Pasadena building code."

Section 14.04.030 - Violations

"All sections in the codes referenced in section 14.04.010 herein pertaining to violations are amended in their entirety to read as follows: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to erect, construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move, improve, move, convert or demolish, equip, use, occupy, or maintain any building or structure in the City, or cause same to be done, contrary to or in violation of any of the provisions of this chapter. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and each person shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each and every day or portion thereof during which any violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance is committed, continued, or permitted, and upon convictions of any such violation such persons shall be punished by a fine or not more then one thousand dollars(\$1,000) or by imprisonment for not more then one (1) year, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

In addition to the above penalty provisions, violation or any of the provisions of this chapter maybe subject to the administrative proceedings set forth in chapter 1.25 of this code."

Section 14.12.590 Substandard Buildings – Conditions Declared / 14.12.660(C) – Weather protection

"Any building or portions thereof including any dwelling unit, guest room, or suite of rooms, or the premises on which the same is located, in which there exists any of the following listed conditions to an extent that endangers the life, limb, health, property, safety or welfare of the public or occupants thereof shall be deemed and is declared to be a substandard building: [14.12.660] Faulty weather protection shall include but not be limited to the following: (C) Defective or lack of weather protection for

exterior wall coverings, including lack of paint, or weathering due to lack of paint or other approved protective covering."

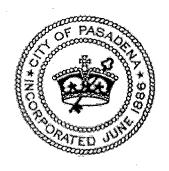

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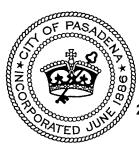

PASADENA MUNICIPAL CODE ESTABLISHMENT OF CITY ADVISORY BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES

Commission/Committee: Accessibility & Disability

Established by: P.M.C. 2.48.020

Purpose and Function:

A. The purpose of the commission is to advise the City Council on accessibility issues in Pasadena.

B. The commission shall:

- 1. Study and examine (a) existing inequities in access to the physical, work, social and cultural environments for all residents of Pasadena, particularly those who have disabilities, and (b) policies, procedures, programs and legislation for eliminating those inequities;
- 2. Recommend policies, procedures, programs and legislation to promote and ensure the accessibility of the physical, work, social and cultural environments to all residents of Pasadena, particularly those who have disabilities;
- 3. Consult and cooperate with other public agencies and commissions on matters relevant to the commission;
- 4. Assist the accessibility and disability issues coordinator to carry out assigned programs and responsibilities.

Number of members and method of selection:

Nine members. Each of the seven Council members and the Mayor shall appoint one member. The final person is selected by the Mayor from a poll and candidates recommended by Council members. Pasadena residency required.

Frequency of meeting:

Once a month.

Qualifications:

- A. All members shall be residents of the city; provided, however, that persons appointed by a director need not reside in said director's district.
- B. Members shall have a demonstrated commitment to the accessibility of the community for all people, particularly those with disabilities, through work on matters such as the rights of persons with disabilities or other activities which promote the accessibility of the community to all people, and shall be familiar with the city and current accessibility issues.
- C. Members shall be selected so as to represent a cross section of the city's disability groups and to include persons with professional experience in the field of disability.

Commission/Committee: Arts & Culture

Established by: P.M.C. 2.47.020

Purpose and Function:

- A. The commission shall advise the City Council on matters pertaining to the city's arts and cultural program which shall:
 - 1. Foster public and private partnerships for providing arts and cultural programs for the youth of Pasadena;
 - 2. Promote access for the public to the highest quality arts opportunities possible;
 - 3. Promote the work of artists and arts groups and celebrate the city for its ethnic diversity, creativity and its leadership in arts and culture;
 - 4. Provide grants-in-aid to individual and group artists, cultural groups and arts organizations;
 - 5. Encourage the provision of cultural and artistic facilities and features in public and commercial construction.
- B. The commission shall appoint highly qualified peer panels for specific time periods to:
 - 1. Select public art and art in public places;
 - 2. Review and evaluate requests for funding;
 - 3. Advise the commission on the allocation of funds from the cultural trust fund and other general fund revenues appropriated to the arts.
- C. The commission shall, from time to time, make recommendations to the City Council on the selection of professional management firms to administer the city's arts and cultural program.

Number of members and method of selection:

Nine members. One appointed by each of the seven Council members and the Mayor. The final person is elected by the Mayor from a poll and candidates recommended by seven Council members. Pasadena residency required. Members required filing annual Statement of Economic Interest.

Frequency of meeting:

Once a month.

Qualifications:

A. All members shall be residents of the city; provided however, that persons appointed by a director need not reside in said director's district.

- B. Members should have a broad and informed perspective of the arts along with a demonstrated knowledge and responsiveness to the existing arts community and community at large.
- C. Members shall represent a cross section of the city's age, multi-cultural, socioeconomic, professional, artistic and volunteer diversity and have an appreciation for Pasadena's rich cultural tradition.
- D. Members shall have a minimum of 5 years' experience in one of the following areas:
 - 1. Arts and cultural organizations;
 - 2. Arts education;
 - 3. Arts patronage or volunteerism;
 - 4. Professional artistry.

Commission/Committee: Code Enforcement

Established by: P.M.C. 2.55.020

Purpose and Function:

The primary purpose of the commission is to hear and rule on cases and appeals regarding enforcement of particular provisions in <u>Title 6</u>, 14, 17, <u>Chapter 8.48</u>, and <u>Chapter 9.58</u> of this code, and to order action on cases of noncompliance presented by city staff. The commission also advises the City Council on code enforcement matters and animal control issues.

Number of members and method of selection:

Nine members. One appointed by each of the seven Council members and the Mayor. The final person is elected by the Mayor from candidates recommended by Council members. Pasadena residency required. Members required filing annual Statement of Economic Interest.

Frequency of meeting:

Once a month.

Qualifications:

- A. All members shall be residents of the city; provided, however, that a person nominated by a director need not reside in the director's district.
- B. No members shall be employees of the city or its agencies.
- C. Members shall possess general knowledge of code provisions related to the commission's purpose and functions (e.g., housing, health, building and zoning).

Commission/Committee: Commission on the Status of Women

Established by: P.M.C. 2.65.020

Purpose and Function:

A. The purpose of the commission is to advise the City Council on the special needs and concerns of women of all ages, races, religions, ethnic and cultural backgrounds, and economic and social circumstances.

B. The commission shall:

- 1. Study and examine through the conduct of meetings, conferences, public hearings or other appropriate methods those conditions which indicate discrimination or prejudice encountered by women;
- 2. Recommend procedures, programs and legislation to promote and ensure equal rights and opportunities for all women in the city;
- 3. Consult and cooperate with other public agencies and commissions on matters relevant to the commission.

C. In connection with the foregoing functions, the commission may:

- 1. Act as conciliator or mediator in disputes within the scope of the commission's functions with the approval of the parties;
- 2. Request of any city department or agency information, services, facilities and assistance in furtherance of the objectives of the commission;
- 3. Coordinate activities of community groups and organizations dealing with equal rights and special concerns of women;
- 4. Collect, coordinate and disseminate information concerning women;
- 5. Develop and maintain a talent bank of women to assist the city in performing its functions.

Number of members and method of selection:

Nine members. One appointed by each of the seven Council members and the Mayor. The final person is selected by the Mayor from a poll and candidates recommended by Council members. Pasadena residency required.

Frequency of meeting:

Once a month.

Qualifications (if any):

A. All members shall be residents of the city; provided however, that a person nominated by a director need not reside in the director's district.

- B. Members should possess knowledge or ability in areas pertaining to discrimination against women.
- C. Members should have exhibited leadership qualities in community activities relating to the general welfare of women in the city.

Commission/Committee: Community Development

Established by: P.M.C. 2.70.020

Purpose and Function:

- A. The purpose of the committee is to review and make recommendations on all matters to come before the community development commission prior to commission action, except emergency matters, and matters which the, by resolution, excludes from committee review and recommendation.
- B. The committee has all the powers of the commission as set forth in Health and Safety Code Section 33000 et seq., and <u>Chapter 2.10</u> of this title, except the power to:
 - 1. Sue and be sued;
 - 2. Sell property;
 - 3. Delegate authority to redevelop in the city to another redevelopment agency;
 - 4. Contract with other public agencies;
 - 5. Acquire property by purchase, lease, gift or eminent domain;
 - 6. Borrow money for redevelopment purposes;
 - 7. Finance housing construction and rehabilitation;
 - 8. Such other powers as shall be withheld by ordinance of the city council or resolution of the commission.

Number of members and method of selection:

Nine members, two of which shall be tenants of the Pasadena Community Development Commission ("Commission") at least one of which shall be over 62 years of age if the Commission has tenants of such age. The two tenant members shall be part-time members of the Committee in that they will review and make recommendations on all matters to come before the Commission prior to Commission action relating to all matters necessary or convenient to carry out the purposes and provisions of the Housing Authorities Law (Health and Safety Code Section 34310 et.seq.). Pasadena residency required members are required to file annual Statements of Economic Interest.

Frequency of meeting:

Twice a month.

Qualifications:

A. Each and all of the seven members nominated by the Council members and ratified by the City Council shall be residents of the city; provided, however, that a person nominated by a Council member need not reside in said Council member's district.

B. The two tenant committee members shall be tenants of the commission. Their successors shall also be tenants of the commission. Such successors shall be appointed for a term of two years and all vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term. If a tenant member ceases to be a tenant of the commission, he/she shall be disqualified as a member and another tenant shall be appointed to fill the unexpired term. If a tenant member ceases to be a tenant of the commission, he/she shall be disqualified as a member and another tenant shall be appointed to fill the unexpired term. At least one tenant member shall be over 62 years of age if the commission has tenants of such age. If the commission does not have tenants, the City Council shall appoint two tenants of the commission has tenants of such age, within one year after the commission first does have tenants.

Commission/Committee: Design

Established by: P.M.C. 2.80.020

Purpose and Function:

- A. The City Council declares that the achievement of quality in the architecture and urban design of the city is required in the interest of the prosperity, social and cultural enrichment, and general welfare of the people. The purpose of this commission is to:
 - 1. Establish procedures for developing design policies for the city;
 - 2. Establish procedures and criteria for review of alterations to the urban and natural environments to assure appropriate design;
 - 3. Encourage public understanding of and involvement in the design quality of the city, and strengthen civic pride in the beauty of Pasadena;
 - 4. Protect and enhance the city's attraction to residents seeking a pleasant way of life, increase its attraction for tourists and visitors, and support and stimulate business and industry by encouraging excellency of design;
 - 5. Safeguard and enhance the visual and aesthetic character, diversity and quality of the city.

B. The commission shall:

- 1. Conduct design review for "public projects" as defined and set forth in the zoning code (Title 17). Jurisdiction shall include architecture, materials, scale, massing, color, lighting, landscaping, open space and any other design concept. After the first meeting of the design commission at which a public project is considered, and at the request of a public agency with concerns about the effect of design review on exceeding a budget, impacting a schedule, or in direct conflict with neighborhood requests about design, the city manager or his/her designee may directly forward an application for design review of a "public project" to the City Council. The general manager of the Rose Bowl Operating Company and the chief operating officer of the Pasadena Center Operating Company shall have this same authority with regard to applications submitted by their respective operating companies;
- 2. Develop and recommend to the City Council objectives and criteria of design for all streetscapes and all features thereof within the public right-of-way, including, but not limited to, street lights, poles, benches, signs, hydrants, trash receptacles and other street furniture and street trees, sidewalks, parkways and special paving treatments for traffic islands and pedestrian crossings. This paragraph shall not affect the installation, maintenance or removal of traffic control devices described in <u>Title 10</u> of this code, provided, however, that the commission may advise on such matters as the mounting and positioning of traffic control devices within the context of developing overall streetscape design criteria;
- 3. Review and recommend to the City Council the aesthetic design concepts of all construction undertaken by the city, including structures, streets, bridges,

- subways, sidewalks, street trees, parkways, landscaping, street furniture and street lights. This paragraph includes projects in which the city is a participant;
- 4. Develop and recommend to the City Council general objectives and standards of aesthetic design for use by all departments of the city;
- 5. Undertake design reviews and hear such matters as are required by <u>Title 17</u> of this code:
- 6. Develop and recommend to the City Council general design objectives, goals and criteria for areas and districts in the city, and for areas of city development, such as the civic center area, redevelopment areas and park areas;
- 7. Develop and recommend to the City Council policies relating to architecture and urban design;
- 8. Work closely with the planning commission, historic preservation commission, community development committee and other advisory bodies and city departments to assure changes to the built environment will be orderly and will not diminish the architectural, aesthetic or design quality of the city;
- 9. Comment and make recommendations upon all environmental impact reports for proposed amendments to the zoning ordinance or map, subdivisions, general plan amendments, redevelopment projects, significant public improvements, and such other land use proposals or projects that may affect the architectural, aesthetic or design quality of Pasadena. The planning director shall refer all such matters to the commission whether or not an environmental impact report is required;
- 10. Participate in revisions of the urban design element of the general plan of the city;
- 11. Review, advise and make recommendations to the City Council relating to the city's master street tree plan and undertake such other reviews pertaining to public trees as are specified in the city trees and tree protection ordinance, Section 8.52.050 of this code.

Number of members and method of selection:

Nine members. The Mayor shall nominate six members from persons recommended by the other seven Council members. One member appointed by A&CC, TAC, HPC, & PC. Pasadena residency required. Members are required to file annual Statements of Economic Interest.

Frequency of meeting:

Twice a month.

- A. All members shall be residents of the city; provided however, that a person nominated by a director need not reside in the director's district.
- B. The criteria for selection of members shall be a demonstrated interest in the community and professional expertise and experience in a design related field, including one or more of the following fields:

- Architecture;
 Landscape architecture;
 City planning;
 Historic preservation;
 Artist;
 Urban design;
 Engineering; and
 Transportation planning.

Commission/Committee: Environmental Advisory

Established by: P.M.C. 2.140.020

Purpose and Function:

- A. The purpose of the commission is to provide policy advice to the City Council for promoting environmental stewardship and urban sustainability in accordance with the City Council's endorsement of the "2005 United Nations Green Cities Declaration and Urban Environmental Accords," the city's adopted environmental charter, and such other related environmental policies as adopted by the City Council.
- B. The purpose of the commission is also to advise the City Council on environmental policy matters related to the following, excluding the daily operations of city departments:
 - 1. Energy;
 - 2. Waste reduction;
 - 3. Urban design;
 - 4. Preservation and enhancement of urban natural areas;
 - 5. Transportation;
 - 6. Environmental health; and
 - 7. Water.
- C. In addition to those matters set forth in subsections A and B of this section, the commission shall advise and make recommendations to the City Council as directed by the City Council.
- D. The commission shall consider environmental matters which have citywide impacts but shall not, directed by the City Council, consider environmental matters relating to specific projects or, including without limitation, compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act.
- E. The commission shall consult and cooperate with other commissions and public bodies on matters relevant to the commission's purposes consistent with provisions in Section 2.45.060
- F. In carrying out its functions and duties, the commission may:
 - 1. Request information, services, facilities and assistance of any city department or agency in furtherance of the objectives of the commission;
 - 2. Study and examine through the conduct of meetings conferences, public hearings or other appropriate methods those matters it is charged with;
 - 3. Conduct outreach and education to the public, business and industry regarding environmental matters of city-wide impact.

Number of members and method of selection:

Nine members. Pasadena residency required. Members are required to file annual Statements of Economic Interest.

Frequency of meeting:

Once a month.

Qualifications (if any):

All members shall be residents of the city; provided, however, that a person nominated by a Council member need not reside in the Council member's district. Members should have experience in at least one of the areas subject to commission purview under Section 2.140.110 or have professional experience in disciplines relating to the environmental sciences.

Commission/Committee: Fair Oaks Project Area

Established by:

Adoption of the Fair Oaks Avenue Redevelopment Project Area Redevelopment Plan, 1985

Purpose and Function:

A. The purpose of the Project Area Committee is to advise the City Council on all matters relating to the implementation of the Fair Oaks Avenue Redevelopment Plan.

B. The committee shall:

- 1. Assisting in community organizing in the formulation and implementation of the Redevelopment Plan and programs, which will carry out the revitalization activities identified in the Fair Oaks Avenue Redevelopment Plan; and
- 2. Serve as the formal means through which the Fair Oaks community members are involved in the planning, the development and execution of the Redevelopment Project to the fullest extent, and have clear and direct access to decision making in all stages of the planning process by reviewing and evaluating project activities and making advisory recommendations as necessary and appropriate; and
- 3. Consult and advise with City agencies concerning policy matters, which affect owner, residents and businesses in the Project Area, and which deal with the planning, provisions for replacement of residential, commercial or industrial facilities for those displaced by redevelopment projects.

Number of members and method of selection:

Seventeen members. Elections are held every two years to select representatives from the Redevelopment Project Area.

Frequency of meeting:

Once a month.

Qualifications (if any):

By-laws govern the committee activities, which require that the committee maintain a fair representation from every segment of the Fair Oaks Avenue Project Area community. Membership to the committee is limited to individuals in the categories identified below and who reside or own property within the boundaries of the Redevelopment Project Area.

The committee consists of the following classifications:

- A. Residential owner/occupant (4-members)
 B. Residential tenant (4-members)
 C. Business Representative (4-members)
 D. Organizational Representative (4-members)
 E. At-large Organizational Representative (1-member)

Commission/Committee: Hahamongna Watershed Advisory

Established by: P.M.C. 2.100.120

Purpose and Function:

To advise the City Council on matters related to the Hahamongna Watershed Park, including:

- 1. Review and recommendation of the Hahamongna Watershed Park master plan;
- 2. Oversight of the preparation of the environmental documents associated with the Hahamongna Watershed Park master plan;
- 3. Oversight of the construction of the Hahamongna Watershed Park restoration project;
- 4. Review of revenue and financing proposals to fund the ongoing operations and maintenance of Hahamongna Watershed Park; and
- 5. Development of a plan for public outreach and community involvement in accomplishing the four functions listed above.

Number of members and method of selection:

Thirteen members. Composed of nine members of Recreation and Parks Commission, two members of the Northwest Commission and two members of the Environmental Advisory Committee.

Frequency of meeting:

Meets every other month; "odd" numbered month.

Qualifications (if any):

Must be a commissioner of the Recreation and Park Commission or a commissioner of the Environmental Advisory Committee (EAC) that has been appointed by the EAC to serve on the Hahamongna Watershed Advisory Committee.

Commission/Committee: Historic Preservation

Established by: P.M.C. 2.75.020

Purpose and Function:

- A. Implement the historic preservation goals, policies and programs of the comprehensive general plan;
- B. Protect, enhance and perpetuate historic resources that represent or reflect distinctive and important elements of the city's cultural, social, economic, political, archaeological and architectural history;
- C. Stabilize and improve property values, and enhance the visual and aesthetic character and environmental amenities of the city's historic areas;
- D. Recognize the city's historic resources as economic assets;
- E. Provide educational programs to promote and encourage restoration, rehabilitation and maintenance of existing historic resources for the culture, education, enjoyment and economic welfare of the city's residents and visitors, and to conserve reusable material and energy resources;
- F. Foster civic pride in the beauty and noble accomplishments of the past by promoting private stewardship of historic resources that represent these accomplishments;
- G. Promote the city as a destination for tourists and as a desirable location for business;
- H. Ensure that the rights of the owners of historic resources and owners of properties adjacent to historic resources are safeguarded;
- I. Fulfill the city's responsibilities as a certified local government under federal preservation laws; and
- J. Fulfill the city's responsibilities for Federal Section 106 reviews and for the California Environmental Quality Act.

Number of members and method of selection:

Nine members, one appointed by each of the seven Council members and the Mayor. The final person is selected by the Mayor from a poll and candidates recommended by Council members. Also includes Landmark District Reps. Pasadena residency required. Members are required to file annual Statements of Economic Interest.

Frequency of meeting:

Twice a month.

- A. All members shall be residents of the city; provided however, that a person nominated by a Council member need not reside in the Council member's district.
- B. All members shall be conversant with Pasadena's historical, architectural and cultural heritage and have special interest, knowledge, or training in fields closely related to historic preservation, such as architecture, history, landscape architecture, architectural history, planning, archaeology, urban design, geography, real estate, law, finance, building trades or related areas.
- C. If possible, the City Council shall appoint at least three members of the commission who are professionals in the fields or disciplines of architecture, landscape architecture, history, architectural history, urban planning, American studies, geography, or archaeology or other historic preservation-related disciplines to the extent that such professionals are available in the community.

Commission/Committee: Human Relations

Established by: P.M.C. 2.58.020

Purpose and Function:

A. The purpose of this commission is to aid the city in achieving better human relations in city government, and to provide assistance to private persons and groups in promoting good will and better relations among all people.

B. The commission shall:

- 1. Formulate ideas and suggest programs in the areas of research and education for the purpose of lessening racial and religious prejudice and of fostering attitudes among the various groups within its jurisdiction which lead to civic peace and intergroup understanding;
- 2. Develop and participate in plans and programs designed to promote the full acceptance of all citizens in the community in all aspects of community life, without regard to race, religion, national origin, age, sex or a minority affiliation;
- 3. Cooperate with and assist in coordinating on a city-wide basis the work of those community agencies engaged in fostering mutual understanding and respect among all racial, religious and cultural groups in the city, or in attempting to discourage discriminatory practices against any such group or any of its members;
- 4. Cooperate with the city manager and, through that office, with the various city departments in identifying and ameliorating human relations problems with which the commission may be concerned;
- 5. From time to time recommend measures, including legislation, to the City Council which will serve to improve human relations within the city;
- 6. Provide a forum where human relations problems may be presented and discussed and their implications evaluated with the understanding that if such problems require corrective action the commission will transmit recommendations thereon to the City Council. Human relations problems include claims of abridgements of equal opportunity in employment, housing and education because of race, religion, national origin, age, sex or a minority affiliation and intergroup conflicts, based upon any of these factors, between the police and residents of the community, and between various groups within the community;
- 7. Maintain close liaison with the police department through the police chief or his/her representatives and promote understanding and cooperation between the police department and residents of the community;
- 8. Cooperate with the police department in assuring that a sound program of human relations training is provided for new recruits, as well as current members of the department;
- 9. Encourage and assist representatives of the local law enforcement agencies, the judicial system and other interested community groups in developing and maintaining harmonious relationships between the law enforcement agencies and the residents of the city;

- 10. Formulate or recommend programs and policies for lessening prejudice, intolerance and discrimination in employment, housing and education for both the general public and the city organization.
- D. The commission shall neither be considered in theory nor function as a police review board.

Number of members and method of selection:

Nine members. One appointed by each of the seven Council members and Mayor. Pasadena residency required.

Frequency of meeting:

Once a month.

- A. All members shall be residents of the city; provided, however, that a person nominated by a director need not reside in said director's district.
- B. Members should be committed to the principle of equal opportunity for all people and have the ability to function harmoniously within a heterogeneous group.

Commission/Committee: Human Services

Established by: P.M.C. 2.86.020

Purpose and Function:

A. For purposes of this chapter, "human services" is defined as a broad range of programs and activities designed to protect, improve and restore the personal welfare and wellbeing of residents of all ages. Typical human services would include, but not be limited to: social services, shelter, economic support, employment and training, education, health and protective services.

B. The purpose of the commission is to advise and make recommendations to the City Council regarding the human service needs of people of all ages in this community. This commission will aid the city in facilitating collaborative efforts and a coordinated approach to improve and expand the delivery of quality human services in Pasadena. This commission is established to respond to significant unmet human service needs and gaps as identified in such documents as the Policy on Children, Youth and Families; Quality of Life Index; Child Care Policy; Needs Assessment; Children's Scorecard, and related materials.

C. The commission shall:

- 1. Facilitate bringing city and community resources together to ensure the delivery of effective human services to people of all ages;
- 2. Formulate ideas and suggest plans and programs designed to promote the availability and effectiveness of human services;
- 3. Promote cooperation and collaboration among local agencies, organizations and commissions involved in the delivery of human services, consistent with the roles and responsibilities outlined in such documents as the Human Services Vision, Fund Distribution Task Force Group Report and the Human Services Strategy and Management Action Plan;
- 4. Recommend priorities to the Council for city resources which respond to identified unmet human service needs;
- 5. Recommend the allocation of city resources consistent with the established priorities for addressing documented human service needs;
- 6. Convene commissions, advisory groups, community agencies, provider organizations, groups and individuals to facilitate effective collaboration in addressing human service issues in Pasadena;
- 7. Advise the Council on ways to achieve human service goals consistent with council-adopted policies which address human services.

Number of members and method of selection:

The Commission shall consist of thirteen members, who shall be nominated as follows: Each of the seven Council members and the Mayor shall nominate one member each for a total of The Pasadena Area Community College Board of Trustees shall nominate one member who resides within the PCC boundaries. The Pasadena Unified School District shall nominate one member who resides in PUSD boundaries. Human services agencies providing services within Pasadena shall recommend three members to the Commission for nomination to the Council, provided that each nominee must represent an agency serving Pasadena residents. All nominations are subject to ratification by the City Council. Members shall be required to file annual statements of economic interest pursuant to the city's Conflict of Interest Code.

Frequency of meeting:

Once a month.

- A. All members nominated by the Council shall be residents of the city; provided, however, that a person nominated by a director need not reside in said director's district. Members nominated by the PCC, PUSD, and the human services commission, from recommendations from human services agencies need not reside within city boundaries.
- B. Persons nominated to the commission should have exhibited a commitment to principles and concepts articulated in such council-adopted documents as The Human Services Vision and Guiding Principles and the Human Services Strategy and Management Action Plan.
- C. Members should have the ability to function harmoniously within a diverse group.

Commission/Committee: Library

Established by: P.M.C. 2.90.020

Purpose and Function:

To advise the City Council on policy relating to the public library system.

Number of members and method of selection:

Nine members. Each of the seven Council members and the Mayor shall nominate one member for a total of eight members. The Mayor shall nominate the remaining one member from persons recommended by the seven Council members.

Frequency of meeting:

Once a month.

- A. All members shall be residents of the city; provided, however, that a person nominated by a director need not reside in said director's district.
- B. Members sould have an interest in the quality of community library services and in the development, improvement and cost effectiveness of those services.
- C. Prior or current community service is also desirable.

Commission/Committee: Lincoln Ave Project Area

Established by:

Adoption of the Fair Oaks Avenue Redevelopment Project Area Redevelopment Plan, 1985

Purpose and Function:

A. The purpose of the Project Area Committee is to advise the City Council on all matters relating to the implementation of the Lincoln Avenue Redevelopment Plan.

B. The committee shall:

- 1. Assisting in community organizing in the formulation and implementation of the Redevelopment Plan and programs, which will carry out the revitalization activities identified in the Fair Oaks Avenue Redevelopment Plan; and
- 2. Serve as the formal means through which the Fair Oaks community members are involved in the planning, the development and execution of the Redevelopment Project to the fullest extent, and have clear and direct access to decision making in all stages of the planning process by reviewing and evaluating project activities and making advisory recommendations as necessary and appropriate; and
- 3. Consult and advise with City agencies concerning policy matters, which affect owner, residents and businesses in the Project Area, and which deal with the planning, provisions for replacement of residential, commercial or industrial facilities for those displaced by redevelopment projects.

Number of members and method of selection:

Twenty-five members. Elections are held every two years to select representatives from the Redevelopment Project Area.

Frequency of meeting:

Once a month.

Qualifications (if any):

By-laws govern the committee activities, which require that the committee maintain a fair representation from every segment of the Lincoln Avenue Project Area community. Membership to the committee is limited to individuals in the categories identified below and who reside or own property within the specified election boundaries.

The committee consists of the following classifications:

- A. Residential owner/occupant (7-members)
 B. Residential tenant (2-members)
 C. Business Representative (8-members)
 D. Organizational Representative (8-members)

Commission/Committee: Northwest

Established by: P.M.C. 2.95.020

Purpose and Function:

A. Serve as a monitoring body for the northwest community;

- B. Work with the city manager and staff on updating and revising the northwest community plan;
- C. Provide ongoing oversight of the implementation of the plan;
- D. Provide periodic advice to the Council on northwest issues;
- E. Present an annual review of the implementation of the plan's projects and programs to the Council and the community.

Number of members and method of selection:

Eleven members. Districts 1, 3 and 5 shall nominate two members. Districts 2, 4, 6 and 7 and the Mayor shall nominate 1 member. All nominations are subject to ratification by the City Council. In making appointments and filling vacancies, all Council members and the Mayor shall ensure that the commission has a majority of representation from the Northwest community. Pasadena residency required. Members of the commission shall not be required to file annual statements of economic interest pursuant to the City's Conflict of Interest Code.

Frequency of meeting:

Twice a month.

- A. All members shall be residents of the city; provided, however, that a person nominated by a director need not reside in the director's district.
- B. No members shall be employees of the city or its agencies.
- C. Members may either possess professional background or personal interest in the areas of housing, human services, employment, economic development, education, public works, finance, arts or culture.
- D. Members should be committed to improving the quality of life in the northwest community and possess a sensitivity and understanding of the diversity of that community.

Commission/Committee: Old Pasadena Meter Zone Advisory

Established by: P.M.C. 2.98.020

Purpose and Function:

- A. Recommend to the City Council the priority expenditures of net revenues from the parking meters within the parking meter zone for street and parking related expenditures which regulate and control traffic and parking within the parking meter zone and its surrounding area.
- B. Study and examine any other parking related issues referred to it by the City Council or by the director of public works and transportation which may include, but without limitation, proposed changes and amendments to the parking meter rates.

Number of members and method of selection:

Seven members shall be nominated by the Mayor from the persons recommended by the other seven City Council members, subject to confirmation by the City Council. Three Commissioners shall be owners of property or officers, employees or agents of a corporation renting or leasing property within the parking meter zone. One Commissioner shall be an "at large" appointee.

Frequency of meeting:

Quarterly meetings.

- A. Three commissioners shall be owners of property, or officers, employees or agents of a corporation owning property within the parking meter zone. Three commissioners shall be renters or lessees of property or officers, employees or agents of a corporation renting or leasing property within the parking meter zone. One commissioner, who shall serve "at large," may be either or both an owner, renter or lessee, or officer, agent and employee of a corporation owning, renting or leasing property within the parking meter zone.
- B. Commissioners shall be persons of business experience and ability to the end that the affairs of a commission shall be administered in the interests of the zone.

Commission/Committee: Recreation & Parks

Established by: P.M.C. 2.100.020

Purpose and Function:

- A. The purpose of the commission is to advise the City Council on all matters concerning recreation, recreational use and programs and all related features of "dedicated parkland," as defined and designated in Chapter 3.23 and of "parks," as defined and designated in Section 3.24.020(F).
- B. The commission shall have the following powers and functions:
 - 1. To advise the City Council on all matters pertaining to recreation, recreational use and programs and all related features of "dedicated parkland," as defined and designated in Chapter 3.23 and of "parks," as defined and designated in Section 3.24.020(F);
 - 2. To stimulate interest in parks and recreation programs and to obtain the greatest possible cooperation and participation of citizens and public and private agencies in such programs;
 - 3. To pursue a policy of public acquisition of land or easements within open space districts:
 - 4. To cooperate and assist in coordinating on a city-wide basis the work of community agencies, social organizations, and special interest groups which support parks and recreation;
 - 5. To cooperate with school districts and other public agencies to maximize the recreational use of school facilities and other public lands;
 - 6. To cooperate with other city commissions and committees in reviewing and evaluating matters pertaining to parks and recreation;
 - 7. To review, evaluate and recommend the establishment of goals and objectives and plans for the acquisition, improvements and utilization of park and recreation facilities and for any other activity over which the commission has responsibility, and issue periodic reports to the City Council and city manager concerning the accomplishment of goals and objectives;
 - 8. To consider, advise and make recommendations to the city council relative to:
 - a. A budget for operating expenditures, capital improvements and all other expenditures relating to public recreation facilities, including parks, playgrounds and special use facilities,
 - Methods and policies for the acquisition, planning, development and improvement of public recreation facilities, including parks, playgrounds and special use facilities and including the selection of contract consultants for the implementation of such activities,

- c. Permits, fees and charges to be made for recreation programs and for the use of public recreation facilities, including parks, playgrounds and special use facilities,
- d. Rules and regulations for the use of existing public recreation facilities, including parks, playgrounds and special use facilities, with an emphasis on equal opportunity of use and on minimizing adverse environmental impacts;
- 9. To perform such other duties as may be described by the Charter or ordinances of the city, or as may be requested by the City Council or the city manager.
- C. The City Council shall respect the responsibilities of the commission and, accordingly, will endeavor, in good faith, to refer matters pertaining to parks and recreation to the commission for advice and recommendations. Notwithstanding the forgoing, nothing in this code shall prohibit the City Council from acting on urgent or other matters without referring the same to the commission.

Number of members and method of selection:

Nine members. Pasadena residency required. Members are required to file annual Statements of Economic Interest.

Frequency of meeting

Once a month.

- A. All members shall be residents of the city; provided, however, that a person appointed by a director need not reside in the director's district.
- B. Members should have a genuine concern for the welfare of residents and the role of the community service and recreation division and this commission to help children, youth and adults to utilize constructively their leisure time.
- C. Past voluntary community service in the city involving various age groups is desirable

Commission/Committee: Planning

Established by: P.M.C. 2.105.020

Purpose and Function:

A. The purpose of the commission is to advise the City Council on the preparation and review of the general plan, as well as the adoption or implementation of programs under the plan, including the creation of districts and zones, modification to and administration of zoning regulations, review of the capital improvements program and review of other programs and projects which affect city development.

B. The commission's function is to:

- 1. Prepare and adopt a comprehensive long-term general plan for the physical development of the city and of any land outside its boundaries which, in the commission's judgment, bears relation to its planning. Such plan shall be known as the general plan and shall include elements as may be required by law and such additional elements which in the commission's judgment relate to the physical development of the city. The commission shall conduct an annual review of the general plan and make recommendation to the council regarding any necessary additions, deletions or amendments. A report on this review shall be included in the commission's annual report;
- 2. Recommend to the officers of the city reasonable and practical means for putting into effect the general plan or any part thereof in order that it will serve as a pattern and guide for the orderly physical growth and development of the city;
- 3. Consult with and advise public officials and agencies, public utility companies, civic, educational, professional and other organizations and citizens generally about carrying out the general plan;
- 4. Initiate, consider and make recommendations to the City Council regarding each of the following matters:
 - a. The acquisition, establishment, opening, widening, narrowing, straightening, abandoning, vacating or sale of any public right-of-way, publicly owned open space, airport or heliport, public building site, or other public way, including proposed freeways, or other public property,
 - b. The location of any bridge, viaduct, subway, tunnel or elevated structure for the use of pedestrians or vehicular traffic or any public building,
 - c. The creation of districts or zones or the acquisition of property for off-street parking,
 - d. The creation of districts or zones, in accordance with the general plan, for the purpose of regulating the use of lands, density of population, the height, bulk, location or use of buildings therein, or the size of yards, open spaces or

- setbacks adjacent to buildings, or the changing, amending or altering of any such zones, districts or regulations;
- 5. Perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Charter, ordinances of the city or state law.
- C. No ordinance, order or resolution shall be adopted by the City Council ordering or involving any of the matters enumerated in paragraphs 1 through 4 of this section unless and until such ordinance, order or resolution shall first have been submitted to the commission for report and recommendation. The commission shall report and make recommendation to the council upon the matter within the time specified by the council or, if not specified, in a timely manner. Upon request by the commission, additional time for report and recommendation may be granted by the Council. If the commission does not report and recommend within the period specified by the Council or otherwise within a reasonable time, the council may thereafter proceed to act upon the matter without such report and recommendation after first making the finding that the commission failed to act within a reasonable time period. Zoning matters shall be governed by the provisions of Title 17, known as the revised zoning ordinance of the city of Pasadena.

Number of members and method of selection:

Nine members. Pasadena residency required. Members are required to file annual Statements of Economic Interest.

Frequency of meeting:

Twice a month.

- A. All members shall be residents of the city; provided however, that a person appointed by a director need not reside in such director's district.
- B. Members should possess or be willing to acquire in-depth knowledge of the community, the operation and interrelationship of various community organizations and city departments.
- C. Members should be familiar with the revised zoning code and the city's comprehensive general plan.

Commission/Committee: Senior

Established by: P.M.C. 2.120.020

Purpose and Function:

A. The purpose of the commission is to advise the City Council on the needs, concerns, and quality of life of all seniors.

B. The commission shall:

- 1. Advise the City Council on the special needs and concerns of seniors of all ages, religions, races, ethnic and cultural backgrounds, sexual orientation and economic and social circumstances;
- 2. Engage in consultation and study with local groups on the needs of the aged and evaluate available resources;
- 3. Collect and study factual information relative to aspects of aging;
- 4. Serve as a liaison between commissions, organizations and governmental agencies which work with the aged and have an interest in aging adults;
- 5. Render advice in the area of community planning regarding the expansion of existing facilities and development of new facility services for the aged, as required;
- 6. Be sensitive to problems of seniors as they arise and recommend plans for actions:
- 7. Inform local, county, state and federal organizations (public and private) of the needs and resources of older people;
- 8. Research and report on developments in other communities dealing with local, county, state and federal programs for the aged;
- 9. Request assistance from city staff as needed.

C. In connection with the foregoing functions, the commission may:

- 1. Coordinate activities of community groups and organizations dealing with the special concerns of seniors;
- 2. Collect, coordinate, and disseminate information concerning seniors;
- 3. Develop and maintain a talent bank of seniors to assist the city in performing its functions.

Number of members and method of selection:

Eleven members. Pasadena residency is required. Each of the seven Council members shall nominate one member; the final person is selected by the Mayor from a poll and candidates recommended by Council members. Human service agencies providing services in Pasadena shall recommend two representatives for nomination.

Frequency of meeting:

Twice a month.

Qualifications (if any):

All members nominated by the city council shall be residents of the city; provided, however, that a person nominated by a councilmember need not reside in said councilmember's district. Members nominated by the senior commission from recommendations of human services agencies need not reside within city boundaries.

Commission/Committee: South Lake Ave. Parking Place

Established by: P.M.C. 2.130.020

Purpose and Function:

A. The purpose of the commission is to operate, manage and control the parking places within the district, and make and enforce all necessary regulations for the maintenance and operation of the district.

B. The commission shall:

- 1. Have possession and complete charge, supervision and control of all parking places acquired or constructed for the use or benefit of the South Lake Avenue parking place district;
- 2. Appoint in the same manner as other city employees are selected, such employees as it deems necessary. The City Council shall determine the number of such employees and their salaries;
- 3. Take appropriate steps to operate and maintain the South Lake parking place district;
- 4. As of January 1, 2008, recommend to the City Council the priority expenditures of net revenues from parking meters in the South Lake parking meter zone for street and parking related expenditures which regulate and control traffic and parking within that parking meter zone and its surrounding area, as set forth in Section 10.45.090 of this code.

C. The commission may:

- 1. Lease any or all parking places, in or outside the district, to any person for the sole purpose of the operation of public parking facilities on them by such person, or may grant a franchise, or make a contract with any person for such purpose;
- 2. Fix, regulate and collect rentals, fees or charges for maintenance and operation of the district and for the parking of vehicles in parking places under its control, and may provide different rates for different classes of customers or users. The annual maintenance and improvement charges shall be fixed after public hearing following such notice as the commission prescribes. The commission may operate the parking places or any thereof, as free public parking places without fee or charge.

Number of members and method of selection:

Five members. Pasadena residency not required; however, at least three members shall be owners of lessees of property, or officers, employees or agents of a corporation owning or leasing property within the SLAP District. Members are required to file annual Statements of Economic Interest.

Frequency of meeting:

Once a month.

Qualifications (if any):

- A. At least three commissioners shall be owners or lessees of property, or officers, employees or agents of a corporation owning or leasing property within the South Lake Avenue parking district.
- B. Commissioners shall be persons of business experience and ability to the end that the affairs of the South Lake Avenue parking place district shall be administered in the interests of the district.

Commission/Committee: Transportation Advisory

Established by: P.M.C. 2.135.020

Purpose and Function:

- A. The primary purpose of the commission is to advise the City Council concerning policies affecting the city's transportation system.
- B. The commission shall study and hold public hearings assessing the economic, environmental and social adequacy of the city's transportation system and shall recommend short and long-range measures for its improvement.
- C. The commission shall study and make policy recommendations to the City Council on the following policy issues:
 - 1. Measures affecting the traffic circulation in the central business district;
 - 2. Annual and long-range allocation of Proposition A funds;
 - 3. The annual and 5-year capital programs of the city regarding streets and transportation;
 - 4. Federal, state and regional actions affecting the transportation network serving Pasadena, including existing and proposed freeways;
 - 5. Inclusion of Pasadena in Southern California's light rail transit network;
 - 6. Measures designed to manage or reduce traffic congestion, including ride sharing, vanpooling, staggering of work hours, application of new technology and encouragement of alternate modes of transit;
 - 7. Provision for a downtown public transit system such as a trolley or shuttle bus system;
 - 8. Protection of residential neighborhoods from negative transportation system impacts;
 - 9. Provision for service to those with limited access to transportation, including the poor, the disabled, the elderly and the young;
 - 10. Energy conservation aspects of transportation;
 - 11. Such other matters as shall be referred from time to time to the commission by the City Council.

Number of members and method of selection:

Nine members. Pasadena residency required.

Frequency of meeting:

Once a month.

Qualifications (if any):

- A. All members shall be residents of the city; provided however, that a person nominated by a director need not reside in the director's district.
- B. Members shall have experience and knowledge in the fields of transportation, urban planning and public services.

Commission/Committee: Urban Forestry

Established by: P.M.C. 2.80.135

Purpose and Function:

The purpose of the Urban Forestry Advisory Committee is to advise and make recommendations to the City Council relating to the city's master street tree plan and undertake such other reviews pertaining to public trees as are specified in the city trees and tree protection ordinance.

Number of members and method of selection:

Seven members which include: Two Recreation & Park Commission members, one Pasadena Beautiful Foundation Rep, two members of the community who are appointed by the City Council, and two Design Review Commission members. Chair rotates among members.

Frequency of meeting: Once a month.

Qualifications (if any):

Four members must be members of other commissions; one member of Pasadena Beautiful Foundation; two members from community at large, one with expertise in forestry.

This report is for information only.

The attached report identifies new California laws impacting the utility, and summarizes key energy and water legislation as of the end of the 2011state legislative session.

UTILITY LEGISLATIVE UPDATE: 2011 End of Session Report

OVERVIEW

During the first year of the 2011-2012 year legislative session, the state legislature passed nearly 900 bills. Sunday, October 9th, was the last day for the Governor to sign or veto these bills. Of the 250 energy, water and regulatory bills tracked by PWP in 2011, only 16 survived the legislative process and were presented to the Governor for signature or veto. SBx1 2 (Simitian) the Renewable Portfolio Standard (RPS) bill was signed by the Governor April 12th, in extraordinary session that ended on September 9th and becomes law December 10, 2011, 91 days after the end of the extraordinary session. All but one of the remaining 16 bills were signed into law and take effect January 1, 2012. All 16 bills are summarized in the "Governors Signed and Vetoed Bill Report".

Many legislators are now reworking their unsuccessful bills to be reintroduced in the next year of the legislative session that commences January 4, 2012. All of the bills addressing Public Goods Charge reauthorization and Public Interest Energy Research funding failed to pass.

NEW LAWS WITH DIRECT IMPACT TO PWP

In the regular 2011 session, Governor Brown signed three bills with direct impact on PWP policies or operations as described below. Senate Bill X1-2 is covered in more detail under separate report.

AB 938 (V. M. Perez) – Translation of Water Quality Notices

Summary: Requires retail water agencies to translate certain portions of Tier 1 Water Quality Notices into Spanish and any other language spoken by 1,000 residents or 10% of the service territory population based on census data. A Tier 1 notice is an unsafe water notice. Specifically, it's a Boil Water, Do Not Drink, Do Not Use or Problem Corrected notice. Required for translation is the warning, the contaminant name and the health effects. Translation is not required for any supplemental information provided. The statute provides the option for the notice to include a phone number for verbal translation of the notice. Pasadena has never issued a Tier 1 Water Quality Notice.

PWP Position: Neutral, as amended. Neutral position was taken in exchange for accepted amendments.

Governor's Action: Signed

Next Steps: Access the American Community Survey in the US Census data to identify list of languages meeting the population criteria. CA Department of Public Health (DPH) currently provides the required translations in Spanish and has "volunteered" to do so for California's top 10 languages. Coordinate with DPH for access to translations. While Tier 1 notices are generally rare, the emergency nature of the notices require they be prepared in advance and kept on file. Must be in compliance by July 1, 2012.

AB 1027 (Buchanan) - Utility Pole Access Rates

Summary: Initiated by the telecommunications industry to "standardize" utility pole attachment rates statewide. This bill establishes POU utility pole attachment rate methodology and processes for auditing and public hearings.

PWP Position: Oppose, Veto letter submitted

Governor's Action: Signed

Next Steps: Determine necessity for Cost of Service study to obtain information required to determine annual cost of ownership, as defined. Evaluation of utility pole attachment rate development tools obtained from APPA for compliance with prescribed rate methodology. Determine if modification of Pasadena Municipal Code is required to accommodate the required public process timeline, pole attachment rate audit provision, or adoption of the annual cost of ownership based rates. Evaluate impact on existing contracts. Must be in compliance by January 1, 2012.

SB 489 (Wolk) - Net Energy Metering

Summary: Prior to SB 489, net energy metering provided utility customers generating power from a wind or solar system eligibility for full retail net energy metering (NEM) under which the electricity purchases of the customer are netted against the electricity generated by the customer's own solar or wind electric system. When the sun is shining or the wind is blowing, the generated electricity spins the meter backward, making it financially equivalent to paying the customer the full retail price for the electricity. This bill expands existing NEM law to include publicly owned utilities. This bill changes several definitions in the Public Utilities Code (PUC) to be consistent with those applicable to investor owned utilities. It revises the definition of a NEM eligible customer-generator to include all customer classes; residential, commercial, industrial and agricultural. This bill widely expands the definition of an eligible customer-generator, from a solar or wind customer-generator, to include generating facilities utilizing any Renewable Portfolio Standard qualified resource as eligible for full retail NEM. The full retail price of electricity includes the utility's generation costs, distribution and transmission costs. By compensating the biogas or other renewable customer-generator at the full retail rate, the utility is using ratepayer funds to pay the renewable customer-generator at a rate well above the value of the generated power.

PWP Position: Oppose, Veto letter submitted

Governor's Action: Signed

Next Steps: Perform analysis of existing and potential NEM customers for fiscal impacts. Determine Pasadena's requirement for accepting new NEM customers relative to the net metering cap of 5% of the utility's aggregate peak demand, through analysis of PWP's existing NEM capacity. Staff determined that compliance with the net energy metering requirements (NEM) in SB 489 would require modification of our rate ordinance. November 7, 2011, the City Council took action to adopt the necessary changes to Regulation 23 and to direct the City Attorney to update the rate ordinance to allow for net metering of the new eligible resources.

Summary: Would authorize the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District to file an application for a permit to appropriate a specified amount of water that is based on the volume of treated wastewater that the district discharges into the Sacramento River, as specified. The bill would authorize the state board to grant a permit to appropriate that treated wastewater upon terms and conditions determined by the state board. The bill would require the board, prior to granting a permit pursuant to these provisions, to comply with permit, approval, and review requirements and other laws applicable to the appropriation of water. This bill contains other related provisions and other current laws.

AB 512 (Gordon D) Local government renewable energy self-generation program.

POWER

Subject: Net Metering

Stakeholder: GBawa

Status: 10/6/2011 - Chaptered by the Secretary of State, Chapter Number 478, Statutes of 2011

Notes: Only applicable to IOUs. Provisions for local gov't wheeling of renewable energy up to 5 MW. PWP does

not support wheeling.

Summary: Would expand the definition of an eligible renewable generating facility for the purposes of the Local Government Renewable Energy Self-Generation Program to include a facility that has a generating capacity of no more than 5 megawatts. The bill would prohibit an electrical corporation from being required to compensate a local government for electricity generated from a facility in excess of the bill credits applied to the designated benefiting account. The bill would prohibit a local government renewable generation facility participating in the program from being eligible for any other tariff or program that requires an electrical corporation to purchase generation from that facility while participating in the program. The bill would exempt an electrical corporation with 60.000 or fewer customer accounts from the program.

AB 631 (Ma D) Public utilities: electric vehicle charging stations.

Summary: Under current law, the Public Utilities Commission has regulatory authority over public utilities, as defined. The current Public Utilities Act requires every public utility to furnish and maintain adequate, efficient, just, and reasonable service, instrumentalities, equipment, and facilities as are necessary to promote the safety, health, comfort, and convenience of its patrons, employees, and the public. This bill would provide that the ownership, control, operation, or management of a facility that supplies electricity to the public only for use to charge light duty plug-in electric vehicles, as defined, does not make the corporation or person a public utility for purposes of the act.

38 (V. Manuel Pérez D) Public water systems.

Status: 10/7/2011 - Chaptered by the Secretary of State, Chapter Number 514, Statutes of 2011

Notes: As amended, only applies to Tier 1(Do Not Drink) water quality notices. Requires translation into Spanish, and any other language spoken by greater than 1000 residents or 10% service territory population as determined by census data. DPH to provide translations for top 10 CA languages.

Summary: Would add environmental documentation to the costs of a single project that the State Department of Public Health is required to determine by an assessment of affordability. This bill contains other related provisions and other current laws.

(Buchanan D) Local publicly owned electric utilities: utility poles and support structures.

POWER

Subject: Rates & Tariffs

Notes: Mandates a rate methodology for utility pole attachment fees charged to cable and telecom providers. PWP has issued a Floor Alert, 2 Opposition letters, and a Veto letter.

Summary: Would require a local publicly owned electric utility to make appropriate space and capacity on and in their utility poles and support structures available for use by cable television corporations, video service providers, and telephone corporations. The bill would require fees adopted to cover the costs to provide this use, and terms and conditions of access, to meet specified requirements, and would specify the manner in which these fees and terms and conditions of access could be challenged. By imposing new duties on local utilities, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program. This bill contains other related provisions and other current laws.

(V. Manuel Pérez D) Self-generation incentive program.

Summary: Under current law, the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) has regulatory authority over public utilities, including electrical corporations, as defined. Current law requires the PUC to administer, until January 1, 2016, a self-generation incentive program (SGIP) for distributed generation resources and to separately administer solar technologies pursuant to the California Solar Initiative. The PUC, in consultation with the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission (Energy Commission), may authorize electrical corporations to annually collect not more than the amount authorized for the SGIP in the 2008 calendar year through December 31, 2011. This bill would extend the authority of the PUC to authorize electrical corporations to continue making the annual collections through December 31, 2014. This bill contains other related provisions and other current laws.

Notes: Last minute gut and amend from Solar initiative to Energy Efficiency bill. Provides financing for EE retrofits of state buildings. Authorizes transfer of 2009 federal stimulus funds. 9/21/11- Sign letter submitted to the Governor.

Summary: Current law authorizes the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission to administer funds appropriated by the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (federal act) for the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program. Current law establishes the Energy Efficient State Property Revolving Fund (fund) and continuously appropriates the moneys in the fund to the Department of General Services for loans for projects on state-owned buildings and facilities to achieve greater, long-term energy efficiency, energy conservation, and energy cost and use avoidance. This bill would, for the 2011-12 and 2012-13 fiscal years, authorize the commission to transfer an amount of money as the commission determines to be appropriate, up to a maximum of \$50,000,000, from the moneys received from the federal act into the fund. By requiring the transfer of moneys into a continuously appropriated fund, this bill would make an appropriation. The bill would require the commission to provide written notice to the Controller on the amount and the timing of the transfer. The bill would require the commission to notify, in writing, the Joint Legislative Budget Committee.

Summary: Would require the California Alternative Energy and Advanced Transportation Financing Authority to administer a Clean Energy Upgrade Program that would be developed by the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission and the authority to reduce the costs to property owners of a loan provided by a financial institution that has a loan program that satisfies the specified requirements. Because this bill would authorize the use of the money appropriated for the Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) Reserve program for the Clean Energy Upgrade Program, this bill would make an appropriation. The bill would require the authority to report annually specified information regarding the program. The bill would increase the amount of the appropriation that may be expended for initial administrative costs to \$550,000, thereby making an appropriation. This bill contains other related provisions and other current laws.

SB 209 (Corbett D) Common interest developments: electric vehicle charging stations.

Subject: Electric Vehicles

Status: 7/25/2011 - Chaptered by the Secretary of State, Chapter Number 121, Statutes of 2011

Summary: Would provide that any covenant, restriction, or condition contained in any deed, contract, security instrument, or other instrument affecting the transfer or sale of any interest in a common interest development, or any provision of the governing documents of a common interest development, that effectively prohibits or restricts the installation or use of an electrical vehicle charging station is void and unenforceable. The bill would authorize an association, as defined, to impose reasonable restrictions on those stations, as specified, and would impose requirements with respect to an association's approval process for those stations. If the station is to be placed in a common interest area or an exclusive use common area, the homeowner would be responsible for various costs associated with maintaining and repairing the station, as well as costs for damage to common areas and adjacent units resulting from installation and maintenance of the station. The bill would impose other responsibilities on the homeowner, including maintaining an umbrella liability coverage policy of \$1,000,000 that names the common interest development as an additional insured. An association that violates the bill's provisions would be liable for damages and a civil penalty, as specified.

SB 263 (Payley D) Wells: reports: public availability.

WATER

Subject: Regulatory

Stakeholder: AKimmey

Status: VETOED by the Governor 10/8/2011

Summary: Current law requires a person who digs, bores, or drills a water well, cathodic protection well, or a monitoring well, or abandons or destroys a well, or deepens or reperforates a well, to file a report of completion

with the Department of Water Resources. Current law prohibits those reports from being made available to the public, except to governmental agencies for use in making studies, to any person who obtains a written authorization from the owner of the well, and to a person performing an environmental cleanup study under certain circumstances. This bill would remove the exception for persons performing an environmental cleanup study, and would additionally authorize the department to make the reports available to academics affiliated with institutions of postsecondary education for specified purposes and to geologists, geophysicists, hydrologists, civil engineers, and persons possessing a specified well contractor's license. The bill would require the department to provide a specified disclaimer when providing the reports to the public. The bill would prohibit specified persons receiving the report to identify the intended use of the report. The bill would prohibit specified persons receiving the report pursuant to these provisions from disclosing the exact location of a well in the report, providing the report to other persons or entities not involved in the conduct of a study; and utilizing the report, or information or data in the report, for the sale, resale, solicitation, or advertisement for sales or services. The bill would provide that knowingly violating this prohibition would be a misdemeanor that would be punishable, upon conviction, by a fine, by imprisonment in the county jail, or by both, as specified. This bill contains other related provisions and other current laws.

SB 489 (Wolk D) Electricity: net energy metering.

Summary: Would revise the definition of an eligible customer-generator to instead require that the generating facility utilize a renewable source listed in the definition of a renewable electricity generation facility that is used for purposes of the Renewable Energy Resources Program administered by the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission. The bill would provide that a small hydroelectric generation facility is not an eligible renewable electrical generation facility if it will cause an adverse impact on instream beneficial uses or cause a change in the volume or timing of stream flow. Notes: Re-allocates \$25 million in currently unusable PACE funds to the Energy Conservation Assistance Account, for use by local governments financing EE upgrades and building retrofits. Sign letter submitted to Governor's office.

Summary: The Energy Conservation Assistance Act of 1979 requires, until January 1, 2013, the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission to provide loans to eligible institutions, including local governments and public institutions, to finance all or a portion of the costs incurred in implementing projects related to energy conservation. This bill would appropriate \$25,000,000 of the unencumbered balance of the \$50,000,000 that was appropriated to the authority to the Energy Conservation Assistance Account, a continuously appropriated account, to be expended by the commission for the purposes of providing loans to eligible institutions, thereby making an appropriation. The bill would revert any unexpended funds appropriated by the above provision remaining in the Energy Conservation Assistance Account on and after January 1, 2013, except to the extent those funds are encumbered, back to the Renewable Resource Trust Fund for use by the authority for the PACE Reserve program. This bill contains other current laws.

Summary: Would expand the definition of "renewable energy" to include energy generation based on thermal energy systems such as landfill gas turbines, engines, and microturbines; and digester gas turbines, engines, and microturbines.

Summary: The federal Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 (PURPA) requires every state regulatory authority with respect to each electric utility, as defined, for which it has ratemaking authority, to determine whether to adopt certain federal standards if consistent with otherwise applicable state law. The federal standards include that no electric utility may recover from any person other than the shareholders or other owners of the utility, any direct or indirect expenditure by the electric utility for promotional or political advertising, as defined. This bill would require the commission to institute a rulemaking proceeding by March 1, 2012, for the purpose of considering and adopting a code of conduct, associated rules, and enforcement procedures, to govern the conduct of an electrical corporation relative to the consideration, formation, and implementation of community choice aggregation programs and to implement the code of conduct, associated rules, and enforcement procedures by January 1, 2013. The bill would require the code of conduct, associated rules, and enforcement procedures to do the following: (A) ensure that an electrical corporation does not market against a community choice aggregation program, except through an independent marketing division that is funded exclusively by the electrical corporation's shareholders, (B) limit the electrical corporation's independent marketing division's use of support services from the electrical corporation's ratepayer funded divisions, (C) ensure that the electrical corporation's independent marketing division does not have access to competitively sensitive information, (D) incorporate rules that the commission finds to be necessary or convenient in order to facilitate the development of community choice aggregation programs, to foster fair competition, and to protect against cross-subsidization paid by ratepayers, and (E) provide for other matters that the commission determines to be necessary or advisable to protect a ratepayer's right to be free from forced speech or to implement that portion of PURPA that establishes the federal standard that no electric utility may recover from any person other than the shareholders or other owners of the utility, any direct or indirect expenditure by the electric utility for promotional or political advertising. This bill contains other related provisions and other current laws.

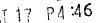

ARTS & CULTURE COMMISSION ANNUAL REPORT FISCAL YEAR 2010-2011

Summary

The Arts & Culture Commission works closely with the Cultural Affairs division to develop and implement an annual work plan that includes four main areas of focus: 1) Support to Artists and Arts Organizations, 2) Public Art, 3) Community Arts and 4) Cultural Tourism. The Cultural Nexus Principles of Cultural Identity, Participation, Economic Growth and Dynamic Support are the foundation for the Commission's work plan objectives while many of the tasks directly relate to Nexus Policies, which support implementation of the Principles.

Examples of Cultural Nexus Principles that were included in the FY 2011 work plan include expanded programs throughout all neighborhoods, programs that make public art a part of the physical fabric of the City and advocacy for arts and culture. Highlights include:

- Community Outreach as a part of the development of a city-wide public art master plan to create a new vision for public art;
- The establishment of a new Rotating Public Art Exhibition Program that reaches neighborhoods and;
- Support for life-long learning and community arts education through the My Masterpieces: Discovering Art in My Community Program, which received the California School Board Association's Golden Bell Award for excellence.

The Commission awarded \$138,970 in City funds through the Annual Grants Program to 26 local arts and culture organizations and individual artists for quality programs that reached every Council District and supported free programming for Pasadena residents and visitors. The Commission expanded the impact of the arts throughout the City by approving additional Cultural Trust Fund monies. Funding for other events and programs included \$1,500 to support the five events that comprised Fall 2010 ArtWeekend; \$106,000 for Fall'10 and Spring'11 ArtNight; and \$15,000 in Mini-grants that enabled 30 small arts organizations to participate in these events. These combined funds also re-circulated throughout the local economy by supporting Pasadena festivals and parades and events in partnership with three City business improvement districts.

In total, the Commission allocated \$261,470 for arts programming that reached over 100,000 audience members during the fiscal year. According to the national Americans for the Arts Economic Impact Study, the local arts economy delivers about \$24 per person in City revenues. By this measure, ArtNight and ArtWeekend events alone generated \$1,056,000 for the Pasadena economy.

Structural changes that were made in FY 2009 to the Annual Grants Program in order to facilitate opportunities for small budget organizations (with annual operating budgets of less than \$200,000) were continued. These small organizations are less likely to have the resources to hire a professional grant writer or development staff than larger budget organizations. Again this year, the Commission maintained its commitment to providing technical assistance workshops. Six free workshops offered opportunities for all Pasadena-based arts organizations and artists to improve grants researching and writing techniques. A special workshop was developed specifically for executive directors to facilitate their use of the Cultural Data Project report capability for use of the data in Board reports, fundraising and publicity materials.

The Commission oversaw the completion and dedication of a new mural for the children's playground at Villa-Parke and reviewed several other public art projects including text and imagery for utility boxes in the Playhouse District; the Rose Bowl renovation project and PUSD student artwork for the Burbank Airport art competition.

Arts education initiatives included the Student Art Wall exhibition at City Hall "Bridging Boundaries," which again showcased artworks of over 60 PUSD students from kindergarten through grade 12. Commission funding provided framing for these artworks which were selected by a community panel from the district-wide student art show "No Boundaries." The Commission also selected PUSD student artwork for the Bob Hope Airport Art Competition.

Continued support was provided for the on-line Arts Resource Directory that identifies resources for grant and exhibition opportunities at the local and national level. The Pasadena Artists' Registry again saw an increase in registered members which allows them to network and to display their portfolios for consideration by prospective clients (including developers, collectors and galleries). Continued support was also provided for the *My Masterpieces* program that uses district-wide curricula based on the collections and resources of local arts and culture organizations. The Cultural Affairs Public Art Walking Tour is the model for the second grade curriculum that reached 12 schools this year. Through these field trips, approximately 1,000 students were exposed to local public art and participated in related hands-on projects. Training was provided to teachers and local docents in conjunction with this program.
