### **COMMUNITY OUTREACH SUMMARY:**

The General Plan Update Advisory Committee (GPUAC) and city staff have led an extensive community outreach program since the City began the General Plan Update. The city has hosted or attended over 160 public events. These outreach events varied widely in their topics, formats, the tools they used, and their locations. Meetings in the opening phases of the outreach focused on broad questions such as, "What do you like about Pasadena?" and "What change would you like to see?" The conversation evolved to more specific topics during the later phases of outreach focusing on where growth should be allowed and prohibited and what changes should be made to the General Plan's guiding principles and policies. The community also contributed to developing alternative growth scenarios, providing comment on these scenarios, and then assisting staff in producing the Draft Concept Plan.

City staff and GPUAC members used a wide array of tools to collect feedback – including comment cards, surveys, group discussions, mapping exercises, community murals, a MoveAbout tour, and a speaker series. In combination with these data collection tools, staff also used a variety of methods to publicize the meetings. Flyers were placed in libraries and at public counters. Messages were distributed through a Facebook fan page (more than 425 fans), email blasts (more than 2,129 subscribers), and through the city's commissions. Staff placed online advertisements with local news sources and transmitted press releases. A commercial about the General Plan Update was also placed on KPAS. In addition the GPUAC helped in getting information to groups that were not typically a part of community dialogue.

Meetings were held and attended throughout the city. Major workshops were held at the P.C.C. Community Education Center in East Pasadena, at Pasadena City College's main campus, at Muir High School, the Villa-Parke Community Center, and in the Central District's Senior Center. (A list of all outreach activities, including the date, location, topics covered, and number of participants is provided in Attachment A)

From the outreach in phase 1, six core themes were identified. These themes included: 1) Maximizing Economic Development, 2) Focusing on "Smart Growth" and Sustainability, 3) Increasing Housing, 4) Directing Growth to East Pasadena and East Colorado, 5) Directing Growth to Major Districts and Corridors, and 6) Reducing Capacity.

During a three day charrette these themes were consolidated into four land use alternatives. To assist the community, commissioners, and staff in developing future land use alternatives which would produce the least amount of traffic while supporting walking and bicycling, transportation staff developed the Pasadena Accessibility tool known as PACScore. PACScore measures and ranks how accessible (being able to walk to places to work, shop and play) various mixes of land use are. During the public outreach phase of the General Plan, PACScore and Vehicle Miles Traveled per capita maps were used to convey to residents the accessibility of all existing land uses. The maps revealed for residents how existing land uses of varying types and intensities provided varying levels of accessibility. It demonstrated the significance of both density

and mixed land use in producing accessible neighborhoods and commercial districts. This analysis graphically demonstrated the relationship between land use and traffic generation. The tools helped shaped the land use diagram so it could achieve high levels of accessibility at densities that are considered compatible and appropriate in the areas where future growth and land use intensification are being considered. Through a survey sent to all residential and commercial addresses, the community expressed a broad range of opinions on the four alternatives. In developing the Draft Concept Map, staff worked to balance the diverse needs and opinions of the community.

In June 2012, two public forums were held to present the Draft Concept Map and development forecasts to the community and obtain feedback. Over 400 residents, business owners and other stakeholders attended community forums in June of 2012 to view and provide comment on the Draft Concept Map. Their comments have influenced development of the attached Draft Land Use Diagram.

To ensure the consistent interaction of policies and diagrams between the Mobility and Land Use Elements Transportation Staff has participated in all outreach activities. Transportation staff has solicited and received comments related to mobility issues and has participated in the public dialog to ensure the various land use alternatives support the goals of the Mobility Element. In addition to General Plan workshops, a series of Mobility Element Community Workshops were conducted to introduce the revised Mobility Element Objectives and the supporting transportation initiatives that will be incorporated into the Mobility Element. The various initiatives such as the Pedestrian, Complete Streets, Transit and Bicycle Plans all included separate public outreach meetings concurrently with the General Plan Update. The Mobility Element Community Workshops brought these initiatives together to demonstrate their relatedness and overarching goal of achieving greater accessibility throughout Pasadena.
