The Mayor introduced Faith Lee and Terrence Williams, newly appointed Field Representatives for State Assemblymember Chris Holden, who provided a brief description of their responsibilities, and responded to questions.

Councilmember McAustin asked Ms. Lee and Mr. Williams to clarify their responsibilities as it relates to the various Council Districts within Pasadena at a later date, noting that she would like a better understanding of how the entire City is served by the Assemblyman's Office.

Mr. Warner presented the award/plaque to the City, which was received by Mayor Tornek.

Meena Pennington, Civic Center Coalition, read and distributed a letter from Darrell Cozen, Pasadena resident, expressing concerns regarding the YWCA/Kimpton project.

Laura Liptak, Catalyst for Change/Civic Center Coalition, read and distributed a letter expressing concerns and comments regarding the request for removal of several public trees at the YWCA/Kimpton proposed project site located at 78 North Marengo Avenue.

Angela Sarni, student at Mayfield Senior High School, thanked Councilmember Wilson for providing the opportunity for her to volunteer at Pasadena Neighborhood Connections during the summer, which she noted to be a great learning experience.

Elsie Robinson, Pasadena resident, expressed concerns regarding an alleged marijuana dispensary in her neighborhood, and requested the City's assistance in addressing the matter.

(1) Find that the proposed action is exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) in accordance with Section 15061(b)(3), the General Rule that CEQA only applies to projects that may have an effect on the environment;

Recommendation:

(1) Authorize an amendment to Contract No. 22,161 with OHL USA, Inc., to increase the contract amount by \$300,000, thereby increasing the not-to-exceed amount from \$10,815,000 to \$11,115,000 for the installation of additional electrical conduit in the La Loma Bridge Rehabilitation Project.
