The above closed session items were discussed, with no reportable action at this time.

On the order of the Mayor, the regular meeting reconvened at 6:30 p.m. The pledge of allegiance was led by Councilmember Gordo.

Police Chief Phillip Sanchez reported on the increase of violence that has transpired in the City from December 20, 2016 through January 9, 2017, and the immediate actions taken by the Pasadena Police Department to help mitigate the violence; and responded to questions.

The Mayor and City Council expressed sympathy and condolences to the families who were affected by the recent shootings and thanked the Pasadena Police Department for their diligence in patrolling the City.

Councilmember Gordo asked the City Manager to agendize the Pasadena Police Department's (PPD) overtime budget as part of a future Finance Committee and/or City Council meeting to discuss any necessary funding augmentation needed to maintain additional PPD patrols in the City and to staff the Special Enforcement Section to address the recent violence.

In response, Steve Mermell, City Manager stated that he would work with Chief Sanchez to determine if an appropriation of funds or an increase to the Pasadena Police Department's budget is necessary, and report back to the City Council. In addition, in response to questions related to PPD's staffing levels, Mr. Mermell reported that based on direction from the Public Safety Committee (PSC), staff is in the process of recruiting college students to conduct a staffing level study, with the study scheduled to begin within the next two weeks, and progress updates to be provided to PSC and City Council.

Councilmember Gordo requested that City staff provide an analysis on appropriate staffing levels for PPD, including information on the impact of the Special Enforcement Section, gang detail units, and historical and current police officer staffing data.

CEREMONIAL MATTERS Police Chief Phillip Sanchez introduced the new Sergeant-at-Arms, Sergeant Glenn C. Thompson, and extended thanks to Sergeant Sean Dawkins for his service as the previous Sergeantat-Arms.

> The Mayor presented a plaque to Michael Johnson, Director of Public Health, and acknowledged the Department for its achievement in receiving recognition as an Accreditation Agency from the Public Health Accreditation Board.

Ara Maloyan, Director of Public Works, recognized and congratulated Steve Wright, City Engineer, on his upcoming retirement after 29 years of service to Pasadena; and introduced Kris Markarian, the new City Engineer.

The Mayor acknowledged and thanked Mr. Wright for his many years of dedicated service to the City, and wished him well on his retirement.

Dale Gronemeier, Eagle Rock resident, spoke on the recent violence that occurred in Pasadena, expressed concerns with increasing the number of police officers, and spoke in favor of increasing the compensation of the Pasadena Police officers.

Donna Perkins, Bible Study Group of Neighborhood Unitarian Universalist Church, spoke in support of utilizing root solutions to stopping ongoing violence in the community, including job training, promoting literacy, and eliminating assault rifles; and expressed concerns with increasing the number of police officers.

Kris Ockershauser, Pasadena resident, spoke on the recent violence that occurred in the City, the need to build trust between the community and the Pasadena Police Department, and expressed concerns with increasing the number of police officers

Michael Horn, Disable Rights Movement, spoke on his belief that teachers should be able to provide testimony on student behavior in the court system and stated the need for police officers to serve and protect individuals with special needs.

Jasmine Richards (Abdullah), Black Lives Matter, spoke on the recent violence that occurred in the City, the shooting victims, the need for preventative action, and for the City to make available counseling for the victims' families.

David Llanes, Pasadena Police Officers' Association, reaffirmed the Pasadena Police Officer's commitment for safety and to serve the City and community.

APPROVAL OF FINAL TRACT MAP NO. 072716 FOR CONSOLIDATION OF TWO LAND PARCELS AND CREATION OF 24 RESIDENTIAL AIR PARCELS FOR CONDOMINIUM PURPOSES AT 377-395 SOUTH MARENGO AVENUE **Recommendation:**

> (1) Adopt a resolution to approve Final Tract Map No. 072716 for the consolidation of two land parcels and the creation of 24 residential air parcels for condominium purposes; and

> (2) Authorize the City Clerk to execute the certificate on the map showing the City's approval of said map.

> Recommendation of the Hearing Officer: The subject tentative map was approved on October 15, 2014 by the Subdivision Hearing Officer, to be recorded within three years.

In 2008, the State passed Senate Bill 1185, which automatically granted a one-year extension to all approved tentative maps. In 2013, the State passed Assembly Bill 116, which allows all tentative maps with an expiration date prior to January 1, 2016, to be automatically extended by 24 months. The 24-month extension is in addition to the one-year extension granted by Senate Bill 1185. Therefore, the amended expiration date of this Final Tract Map is October 15, 2020. (Resolution No. 9542)

CONTRACT AWARD TO HARDY & HARPER, INC., FOR PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE OF STREETS – 2016 FOR AN AMOUNT NOT-TO-EXCEED \$976,000 Recommendation:

(1) Find the project proposed in the agenda report to be categorically exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) State Guidelines in accordance with Title 14, Chapter 3, Class 1, Section 15301, minor alterations of existing public facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that previously existing at the time of the lead agency's determination; and

(2) Accept the bid dated December 28, 2016, submitted by Hardy & Harper, Inc., in response to the Specifications for the Preventive Maintenance of Streets – 2016, and authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract not-to-exceed \$976,000 which includes the base contract amount of \$888,000 and a contingency of \$88,000 to provide for any necessary change orders. CONTRACT AWARD TO SLATER WATERPROOFING, INC., FOR PARKING GARAGE MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS FOR AN AMOUNT NOT-TO-EXCEED \$2,120,000 Recommendation:

(1) Find the project proposed in the agenda report to be exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) State Guidelines in accordance with Title 14, Chapter 3, Article 19, Class 1, Section 15031, minor alterations of existing public facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that previously existing at the time of the lead agency's determination, and find that there are no changes to the project, change circumstances or new information that would warrant further environmental review; and

(2) Accept the bid dated November 22, 2016, submitted by Slater Waterproofing, Inc., in response to the Project Specifications for Parking Garage Maintenance and Repairs, and authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract not-to-exceed \$2,120,000 which includes the base contract amount of \$1,929,478 and a contingency of \$190,522 to provide for any necessary change orders.
