SUBJECT: PURCHASE ORDER CONTRACT AWARD TO BODYWORKS EQUIPMENT, INC. FOR AS-NEEDED LABOR AND REPAIR ON REFUSE COLLECTION VEHICLES FOR A NOT-TO-EXCEED AMOUNT OF \$330,000

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

1. Find that this action is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) in accordance with Section 15061(b)(3), the General Rule that CEQA only applies to projects that may have an effect on the environment; and
2. Accept the bid dated June 5, 2017 submitted by Bodyworks Equipment, Inc. in response to specifications for Certified Heil Labor and Repair, and authorize the issuance of a purchase order contract with Bodyworks Equipment Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$330,000 over a three-year period with the option for two additional one-year terms in the annual amount of \$110,000, at the discretion of the City Manager, for a maximum total contract length of five years and a total contract amount of \$550,000.

BACKGROUND:

The Department of Public Works, Building Systems and Fleet Management Division (BSFMD) repairs and maintains the City's fleet. The City operates and maintains a fleet of refuse collection vehicles, 18 of which are equipped with a Heil brand body. In order to ensure that these vehicles receive necessary repairs and maintenance in a timely manner, BSFMD outsources some of the labor and repair to an outside vendor on an as-needed basis. On May 11, 2017, a Notice Inviting Bids for Certified Heil Labor was published in the *Pasadena Journal* and posted on the City's website, which generated notices to 350 vendors. Five vendors downloaded the bid documents, none were located in Pasadena.

Per the bid specifications, bidders were asked to provide an hourly labor rate that they would charge the City for repairs on Heil refuse collection vehicles. Additionally, bidders were asked to provide unit prices for Original Equipment Manufactured parts expected to be included in repair orders. One vendor submitted a bid by the bid closing date of June 6, 2017. The bid result is as follows:

The bid proposal was evaluated by BSFMD staff and Bodyworks Equipment, Inc. was found to be both a responsive and responsible bidder. Although the City received only one bid, staff recommends awarding the contract to Bodyworks as there are no other Heil-authorized service and repair facilities located in Los Angeles County for Original Equipment Manufactured service or warranty work. The City has done business with Bodyworks in the past, issuing purchase orders totaling over \$2,100,000 since 1997 for refuse collection vehicle parts and repairs. All prior work has been performed to the satisfaction of the City on a cost-effective basis.

Based on prior years' actual expenditures for Heil labor and repair, staff estimates it will need an annual purchase order contract authorization of \$110,000. The Department of Public Works recommends that the City Council authorize a purchase order contract with Bodyworks Equipment, Inc. for as-needed Heil service and repair, for a three year period in an amount not-to-exceed \$330,000. The contract may be extended for two additional one-year terms not-to-exceed \$110,000 annually, subject to the approval of the City Manager and without further City Council approval, provided that the contract pricing terms remain the same.

COUNCIL POLICY CONSIDERATION:

Approval of this contract award addresses the City Council's goals of maintaining fiscal responsibility and stability and ensuring public safety.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT:

This purchase complies with all South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) rules and regulations.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The total cost of this action is \$330,000. Funding for this fiscal year will be addressed by utilization of existing budgeted appropriations in the Fleet Maintenance operating budget account 811400-50322058.
