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As a person of faith, believing in the dignity of all people, we have no right to leave a property vacant when it could be used to house our seniors and especially when the funding is available to build it. Housing homeless seniors has the overwhelming support of Northwest Pasadena residents, especially people of faith. The City Council has already received over 400 letters supporting PSH signed mainly by church members from Northwest Pasadena, and petitions signed by close to one hundred of the businesses and neighbors closest to this site. Two prayer vigils have taken place at Heritage Square South—one with 30 people attending, and the second with over 60 participants, some of whom slept overnight in solidarity with their homeless brothers and sisters, many whom already stay on this site but without a roof over their heads. The Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance has called for homeless housing at Heritage Square South.

When Vice Mayor John Kennedy held a crowded community meeting close to this site, 80% indicated they were in support of this site for homeless seniors. There has been little to no indication of NIMBYism in Northwest Pasadena. (NIMBY= Not In My Back Yard.) On the contrary, the residents of NW Pasadena see homeless housing as an asset to our community.

In July, 47 people showed up at the Ed Tech Committee, including pastors, calling for homeless housing at Heritage Square South. As a result, the Ed Tech Committee unanimously recommended that this site be used for a mix of both commercial development and homeless housing. When the full council votes on Dec. 17th, please follow the lead of the City Council's ED Tech sub-committee.

I feel it is crucial that you approve using Heritage Square South for homeless housing ASAP not only because the community wants it, and not only because there is a huge need, (with a 65% increase in homelessness among seniors in the past three years), but also because it will set a powerful example to other parts of the city where the residents still don't understand the value or the need of permanent supportive housing as a powerful, proven best practice that ends homelessness.



Dear Mayor and City Council members,

I am a 30-year resident of Northwest Pasadena I have lived near the intersection of North Madison Ave and Orange Grove BI for the last 18 years I'm writing today in support of using the Heritage Square South property as a place to build permanent supportive housing for homeless seniors

Until it closed last summer, I was involved with Reformation Pasadena, the church on the corner of Madison and Orange Grove One of the people who often showed up for Sunday services and Wednesday suppers was an older man named George George was a familiar face in our neighborhood, and while he had always been something of an odd bird, about a year ago we noticed that he was declining significantly. When he showed up, he was unkempt, his clothes were soiled, and his alcoholism was out-of-control. When he started sleeping in the bushes outside the church on Orange Grove BI, certain area residents became upset. (One person even called our reluctance to push him out as "aiding and abetting," as if George were some kind of criminal.) We tried to talk to him, to contact his family, and to make a strategy for a way to get him services, but we were not successful. Finally, when the school renting the church cut down the bushes behind which he was sleeping, he simply moved on People reported seeing him hanging out near the corner of Lake Ave. and Washington BI. I don't know where he is now.

There's the older lady who used to camp out behind the Ralph's on Lake Ave, the older man who hangs out by the Wells Fargo Bank and Starbucks on Lake and Green St, not to mention the increasing numbers of people I see sleeping in the abandoned parking lot on Maple and Los Robles and by the Lake Ave Gold Line Station. A project like Heritage Square South would benefit George and these other homeless neighbors who need permanent supportive housing. Without it, our homeless senior residents will continue to be pushed around to various parts of the city until they die. What a way to live one's final days on earth!

That's why I urge the City Council to consider using the Heritage Square South property for 69 units of permanent supportive housing (PSH) for homeless seniors. This proposal has the overwhelming support of Northwest Pasadena residents, especially people of faith. This property was purchased with HUD and other funds for affordable and very low income housing and should be used for that purpose. The need is huge and the funding is available. Please take action as soon as possible to address our City's homelessness crisis.

I love my community, and I want to be a place where seniors can live safely and thrive during the last season of their lives.
