Despite the workers' contributions to the hotel, the company did not make any commitment to recall them when business resumes.

After 9/11, the City of Santa Monica passed a right of recall policy to ensure that hotel workers displaced by the economic impact of 9/11 would return to work. Glendale, the City of Long Beach, and the County and City of Los Angeles recently passed similar policies to deal with the economic insecurity wrought by the COVID-19 pandemic. Please support a similar law here in Pasadena.
