I am asking you to please give your support to the Worker Retention and Recall ordinance. We need to pass a law that will ensure hotel workers a right to return to their same jobs when it's safe to do so. This is where your unique ability to generate the quality of life in Pasadena comes to fruition. Please always consider the Person within each decision you make: use your power for good.

I very much appreciate the attention you have recently given to Police reform. I grew up here from the early 1960s and I can say, your current willingness to rethink policing procedures in Pasadena is needed. For a beautiful City with a substantial African-American community, it should not be scary for a Black person to encounter law enforcement here. The Police are meant to "Protect and Serve."
