Comments

I am concerned that we continue to keep our city's largest "FREE to All" space closed. Living in the area, I made at least 10 trips down to the loop in the days before the city closed the area. I even saw the police cars observing the loop from Lot K. I observed safe distancing by almost every loop user as I was surprised with how well people were following and respecting the signs asking for people to safety space. So why did we close our FREE space and push people into the surrounding neighborhoods whereby now pedestrians weave out into traffic to avoid each other in a more confined area? Was it because the city wanted to set up and isolate the mobile homes in Lot K and a Testing Center near Brookside? With many parks around the country open (including Central Park in New York) for citizens to safety use, couldn't we consider a better solution that allows the city to facilitate the mobile homes/testing and the citizen to use our open space? I suggest we open Brookside to foot traffic similar to during tailgates, reopen the loop and move the mobile homes/testing down toward the aquatic center.
