Pasadena via Friends In Deed has plans to shelter 55 or so of the most vulnerable of those during the most inclement weather.

Yes, allocate additional funding for weather-activated motel vouchers (agenda item #6) to allow more nights and/or more people to have shelter.

There are additional measures which I recommend also be taken:

- 1. Suspend Ordinances re: Loitering and Overnight Parking to Allow Our Unsheltered Residents to Shelter in Vehicles and City-Owned Structures.
- 2. Set up locker stations to be managed by interested religious and community organizations. Unsheltered residents need safe places to store valuable documents and excess bags over the two bag allowance often required at shelters.
- 3. Generate funds for additional outreach workers. Pasadena Department of Housing has stated that lack of social services staff is the main problem in sheltering our unhoused residents during bad weather. Pasadena needs access to an increased number of qualified social workers dedicated to the needs of our unsheltered residents.

I urge the Council to approve sufficient funding for motel support for as many of our unsheltered residents as possible, recognizing the limited outreach workers available. For those who are not offered motel support, I urge the Council to ensure transportation to and from LAHSA shelters, including for those who do not have cellphones. Additionally, given that there is a two-bag limitation at the LAHSA shelters and many, many of our unsheltered residents have belongings needed for survival exceeding that amount, I urge the Council to direct the Department to explore ways our unsheltered residents can secure their belongings while at a LAHSA shelter. Unsheltered residents should not be required to place their survival belongings at risk of loss in order to receive shelter in bad weather. The Council should also authorize shelter in the FEMA trailers that are sitting in storage at the Rosemont Pavilion. Finally, the Council should suspend ordinances prohibiting overnight parking on city streets and overnight shelter in city structures in bad weather this winter.
