My name is Adam Resnick. I work in Pasadena. Although I am not a current resident of Pasadena, I do spend a lot of my recreational time hiking along the Arroyo and am thus very interested in the protection of the Arroyo and its ecosystem.

I believe PWP has a responsibility to be a steward of its natural resources. In line with this belief, a living stream approach for the Arroyo is a better, more resilient way to approach water conservation than an artificial spreading basin. Such an approach would also help to protect the native fish, including steelhead trout, that have recently been confirmed to be present. By helping the Arroyo and its native fish, we also can improve the health of the entire ecosystem. As John Muir said, "When one tugs at a single thing in nature, he finds it attached to the rest of the world."
